# Tennis pair wins the gold at Phillipsburg

The Goodland High girls tennis team placed third at the Phillipsburg Round Robin tournament Tuesday, winning five of nine matches.

Joining Goodland at Phillipsburg were the teams from Osborne and Victoria.

Each match consisted of one eight-game set going to a tie-breaker at 7-all if necessary.

Juniors Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson won all three of their matches at No. 2 doubles defeating the pair from Osborne 8-2, from Phillipsburg 8-1 and from Victoria 8-0.

Junior Jillian Parker went 1-2 at No. 1 singles. Parker lost to Sloane Hardman of Osborne 8-3 and to Melinda Schremmer of Phillipsburg 8-1. In her third match, she defeated Kelsi Wilson 8-7 winning the tie-breaker 7-4. Hardman won the gold medal.

The Cowgirls' No. 1 doubles team of seniors Kali Rietcheck and Megan Stefan also went 1-2 losing to their opponents from Osborne 8-5 and from Phillipsburg 8-0. In the third round, Rietcheck and Stefan defeated Phillipsburg's backup

doubles team 8-3 which was playing in the spot reserved for Victoria which did not have an entry.

Kayla Jarvis and Allison Dusin of Phillipsburg won the gold medals at No. 1 doubles.

Goodland did not enter a No. 2 singles player. Sara Fawver of Phillipsburg went 3-0 to win that bracket.

The Lady Panthers of Phillipsburg won the tournament scoring 25 points with Osborne second with 21. Goodland scored 12. Victoria only entered players in two of four brackets and failed to win a match.

The Cowgirls head to Colby Saturday for a tournament starting at 8 a.m. (Mountain Time) at the courts behind the Community Building.

## Jasper races return to town

# Brewster, Wallace County play in opener

The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster and the Lady Wildcats of Wallace County High in Sharon Springs

opened their seasons last Saturday at the Healy Invitational, with Wildcats defeating the Bulldogs 25-17, 25-15 in the championship.

In pool play, Wallace County, led by first-year coach Wendy Benisch, defeated Healy 25-18, 25-14, and South Gray High of Montezuma 25-14, 25-17; and lost to Golden Plains of Rexford 25-23, 17-25 and 25-17.

In the semifinals, the Wildcats beat Otis-Bison 25-20, 25-15 to advance to the championship.

Brewster defeated Ingalls 25-8, 25-10; Otis-Bison 25-11, 25-16; and Cheylin High of Bird City 25-14, 25-17.

The Bulldogs beat Golden Plains

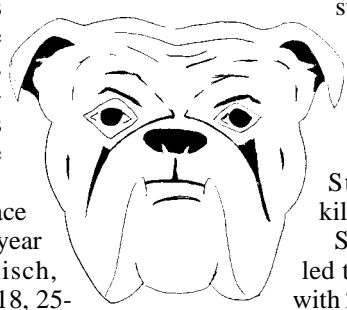
25-20, 25-15 in their semifinal match.

Junior Avery Schultz led Brewster with 25 kills in the tournament, followed by senior Caitlin Rush with 21. Senior Kasie Stevenson had 18 kills.

"We played fairly well for our first matches of the season," said Brewster coach Lynda McKee. "We had some mental letdowns, especially against Sharon Springs in the championship match, so we will focus on playing with more intensity."
