Team upset in season opener

All eight football teams of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference opened their seasons last Saturday, with one of the four nationally ranked teams suffering an upset.

The Broncbusters of Garden City Community College won their opening game, at home Saturday, defeating Fort Scott Community College

Garden City, ranked No. 24 in the National Junior College Athletic Association preseason poll, took a 7-0 lead early in the first quarter.

Fort Scott tied the game at 7 about six minutes later, but the Broncbusters regained the lead at 14-7 with about two minutes left in the period.

Neither team scored in the second and third quarters.

About halfway through the fourth period, Garden City scored its third touchdown, increasing its lead to 21-7.

Fort Scott scored the game's final touchdown, but missed the extra point, making the final 21-13.

Garden City freshman Derrick Raymer, a former Goodland Cowboy, punted seven times averaging 44 yards per kick, with his longest going 58 yards.

The Broncbusters go on their first road trip of the season Saturday to take on the Pirates of Independence Community College.

The Pirates opened their season with a 30-10 victory over Highland Community College.

The Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College were upset by Dodge City Community College 55-38.

The Dragons, No. 16 in the preseason poll, scored first but trailed 14-3 after the first quarter and 28-17 at halftime.

By the end of the third period, Hutchinson narrowed the point margin to five at 35-30.

The Dragons got within three at 41-38 early in the fourth quarter but Dodge City's defense stiffened while its offense scored two more touchdowns.

Hutchinson faces Fort Scott in its home opener Saturday while Dodge City visits Butler County Community College.

The Grizzlies of Butler County, ranked No. 3 in the preseason poll, defeated No. 15 Trinity Valley Community College (Texas) 26-17.

The Grizzlies trailed 17-13 at halftime but scored on a pair of field goals in the third quarter and passed for a touchdown in the fourth for the win.

The Red Ravens of No. 9 Coffeyville Community College defeated the U.S. Air Force Academy Prep School

The Ravens go on the road to face Highland on Saturday.

Cowboys face Indians in opener

Two high school football teams from last year's state playoffs square off tonight at Cowboys Stadium when the Hoxie Indians visit Goodland in the season opener for both squads.

The Cowboys are coming off a 10-2 season which ended in the state Class 4A quarterfinals. Hoxie finished 8-3, losing in the second round of the Class 2-1A playoffs.

"Hoxie won't be an easy opponent," said Coach Jon McLean. "Historically, they've been a very good team, and although we've beaten them the last three years, they still went on to have good seasons."

Goodland defeated the Indians 40-12 in Hoxie in last year's season opener. The Cowboys led 21-0 at halftime, holding Hoxie scoreless until the middle of the third quarter. All five Goodland touchdowns came on runs of seven yards or less while both of the Indians' were on runs of over 50 yards.

The Indians have nine seniors on their roster this season, including Toliver Bird, a first-team Northwest Kansas All-League selection last year at linebacker, and a secondteam pick as a running back. In last year's game, Bird ran four times for 83 yards, including a 59-yard touchdown. He also led the Indians in tackles with 21.

Other all-league players returning for their senior season are Tim Erwin, who was a first-team pick at defensive end and made the second team as a receiver, and Tyler Baker, a second-team selection at quarterback who earned honorable mention as a defensive back. Both made seven tackles against Goodland last season, and Erwin returned a kickoff 51 yards.

The Cowboys have eight seniors back from last year's squad, including three who earned all-league honors: Mark Starr, a second-team lineman; Jase Herl, second-team special-teams player. defensive back; and Heath

"Wyatt has excellent athletic ability," McLean said. "He is fast and quick, and will do a solid job at quarterback. I'm excited to watch him run the team."

"Heath has very good hands and will a big play threat from his tight end position," said McLean. "Derek will also be a big play threat who will get better as the season

A pair of seniors, Herl and Jon Beeson, will anchor the Cowboys' defensive backfield. Last season, Herl was third on the team's tackle list. He also intercepted a pass and returned a fumble 14 yards for a touchdown.

"Jase is our defensive leader at safety." McLean said. "He does a really good job getting us organized. Jon is going to give us some quality time in the defensive backfield, he has an aggressiveness and a little craziness to him that you need on the football field."

Leading Goodland's linebacking corps is senior Bobby Miller. Last year, in a season cut short by injury, Miller recorded eight tackles. As a running back, he gained 82 yards on 16 carries. As a sophomore, Miller earned all-league honorable mention at running back.

"It is great to have Bob back on the team," McLean said. "He will be a 'horse' as both our fullback and middle linebacker.'

Solidifying the Cowboys line on both sides of the ball are seniors Mark Starr and Brandon Tatman.

"I expect Mark to have a big year," said McLean. "He is big, strong and fast, and we're looking for him to cause a lot of problems from his nose guard position. Brandon has a knack for being around the ball. He has good speed which we will use on offense by pulling him out on a lot of plays.

"I enjoy having all these seniors and I want them to have a great year. If we get some good breaks, I'm confident they will."

McLean said Hoxie runs a "scary" double-tight-end and double-wingback offensive scheme that includes a lot of misdirection.

"We're going to have to be fundamentally sound on defense," he said, "and not give up the big plays. We can't afford a breakdown of de-


