

# Cowgirls golf team places second here

The Cowgirls golf teams placed second and fifth at the Goodland Invitational on Tuesday at Sugar Hills Golf Club with two Goodland players finishing among the top 10.

Sophomores Sammie Raymer and Eryn Topliff both finished with 103 for 18 holes to lead Goodland's Team I. Raymer won the scorecard tie-breaker for eighth place overall, with Topliff ninth.

Freshman Chelsie Gausman shot a 106 and senior Sami Philbrick a 117. Other players for Team I were seniors Julie Leiker who shot a 119 and junior Brooke Whitmore who had a 120.

Goodland's Team II was led by junior Amber Webster who shot a 117. Junior Kerri Bellamy shot 123, sophomore Holly Kibel a 127 and sophomore Heidi Yonkey a 132. Freshmen Michelle Smith (136) and Sam Erickson (144) also played for Team II.

Cheyenne George of Syracuse won the tournament with a 15-over-par 86, two strokes better than Hugoton's Trista Nordyke. Cali Shamburg of Syracuse was third with a 96 followed by teammate Paige Williams with a 97. Breanna Weber of Thomas More Prep-Marian finished fifth with a 98.

The Lady Bulldogs of Syracuse won the team competition scoring 383. Goodland Team I scored 429. Hugoton and Thomas More Prep both finished with 441 with Hugoton getting third after the tiebreaker.

Goodland Team II scored 499. In the junior varsity competition, Goodland was led by freshmen Linsey Owens and Courtney Sheldon who both shot 69 for nine holes. Sophomore Renea Reasoner and freshman Natasha Cecil both shot 72, and freshman Danielle Pettibone shot a 76. Syracuse's Kayla Schmidt has

# Tennis team places fifth

The Goodland High School girls tennis team placed fifth among 10 teams Saturday at the Colby Invitational.

The field was split into two pools of five teams each. After playing all four matches in their pool, players had a final match against their counterparts from the other pool based on their record for the day. The top girl or doubles team from one pool played the top girl or team from the other, No. 2 played No. 2 and so forth. Each match consisted of one seven-game set, with a tie-breaker at 6-all if necessary.

The Cowgirls No. 2 doubles team, juniors Sandy Johnson and Jena McCall, finished second with a 4-1 tournament record to earn the silver medal. They were undefeated in pool play, beating their opponents from Phillipsburg 7-3, Liberal 7-2, Ulysses 7-1 and Norton 7-1.

Johnson and McCall's only loss came in their final match against Kaylie Dugger and Rashaun Wil-

son of Colby, 7-3.

Junior Jillian Parker earned the fourth-place medal at No. 1 singles, going 3-2 in the tournament. In pool play, she won her matches against the player from Scott City 7-2, Ulysses 7-5 and Garden City 7-3, and lost against Osborne 7-1.

In the match for third place, Parker lost to Melinda Schremmer of Phillipsburg 7-1.

Goodland's No. 1 doubles team, seniors Kali Reitcheck and Megan Stefan, finished seventh with a 2-3 record. In pool play, the pair went 1-3, defeating the team from Plainville 7-0, and losing to Osborne 7-5, Colby 7-1 and Phillipsburg 7-1.

Reitcheck and Stefan defeated Maddie Plunk and Jessica Lash of Liberal 7-3 in their final match.

The Cowgirls hit the courts again starting at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday for the Goodland Individual. Seven other teams will be in town for the tournament with matches at Steever and Chambers parks.

# Goodland Cowboys off to battle St. Francis

The Cowboys football team travels to St. Francis this afternoon for its first road trip of the season.

They could be meeting some unhappy Indians.

St. Francis lost its opener to the Red Devils of Decatur Community High of Oberlin last Friday 21-18 after leading at halftime 12-0. In the final seconds of the fourth quarter, the Indians were less than a yard from the end zone but could not stop the clock — or move the ball. Time ran out on third down, giving Oberlin its first win over St. Francis since 1992.

The Indians dominated the ground game against Oberlin, outgaining the Red Devils 307 to 124. Jordan Gienger led the St. Francis rushing attack with 132 yards on 25 carries, scoring two touchdowns. Gabe Smull ran 22 times for 83 yards and Dylan Loyd 18 times for 75 yards and the other Indian touchdown.

Quarterback Matt Brown completed one of five passes, to Loyd, for 19 yards. On the ground, Brown gained 17 yards on three carries.

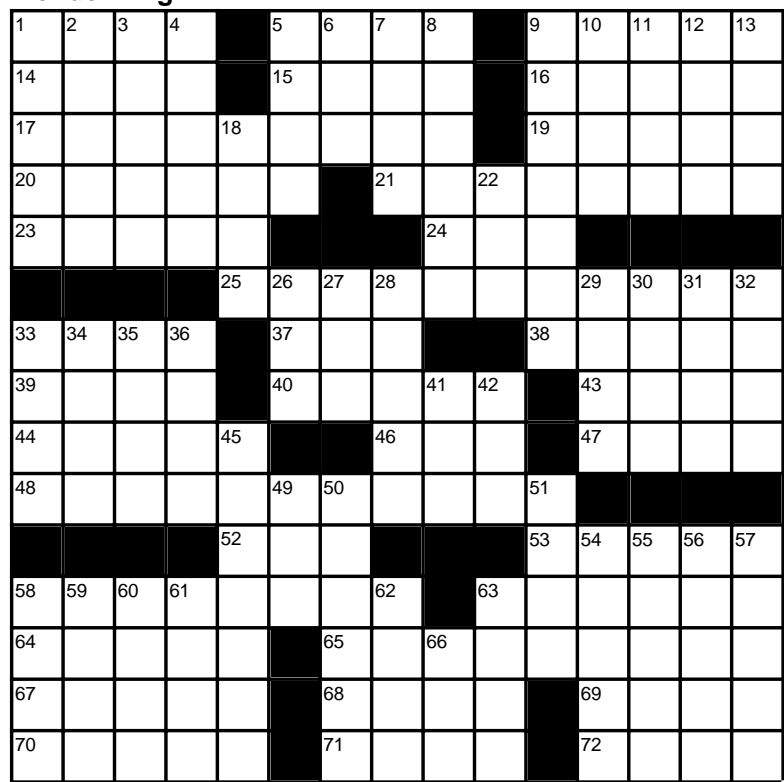
The Indian defense was led by Levi Weeden, who recorded 16

tackles against Oberlin. Loyd, Smull and A.J. McAtee each had nine tackles. As did Hoxie last week against Goodland, St. Francis had trouble converting extra points, failing in all three of its attempts while Oberlin was successful on two of three, kicking one and running another. The Indians fumbled three times, losing all three.
