Goodland graduate sings in top chorus

A Goodland High School graduate is part of a chorus that took first in its size category and second place overall at the International Sweet Adeline Harmony Classic competition in Greenville, S.C.

Bridget Troyer, daughter of Richard Emig of Goodland, is a member of the Wamego Dutch Mill Chorus, which took second place at the competition Saturday, July 23.

The chorus is led by director Jeanette Hupe of Wamego. Members come from Marysville, Frankfort, Clay Center, Waterville, Manhattan, Alma, Paxico, Silver Lake, Rossville, St. George, Westmoreland and Wamego every Monday for rehearsal. They range in age from 19 to 76.

The chorus was one 10 in the competition. Five competed as

small choruses, up to 40 members each, and five as mid-size choruses, 41 to 60 members.

The five in each size category were invited to the competition because they were top-scoring groups in regional competition.

The Wamego chorus placed first in the small competition and second overall, scoring only four points less than the first-place Wichita chorus, at regional competition in Kansas City in the spring. The chorus received the Ruby Pike Award for highest score in the sound category among the small choruses.

There are 46 women in the chorus. It was chartered in 1981 and has placed first 17 times as a small chorus at the regional competition. This was its first time at an international competition.

Hansen foundation offers 220 scholarships

The Dane G. Hansen Foundation is taking applications for its 220 scholarships available to students in 26 northwest Kansas counties.

Students from an accredited high school, or registered independent, private or home school in the counties can apply.

Among the counties are Sherman, Wallace, Thomas, Cheyenne and Rawlins.

Ten Leaders of Tomorrow scholarships are for \$5,000, renewable for three years. The 35 Hansen Scholar awards are \$3,000, renewable for one year, providing the recipients have at least a 3.0 grade point average.

Recipients must attend an accredited four-year public, private or church-related Kansas college or university.

Seventy Hansen Student Scholarships of \$2,000 each (non-renewable) are available. Recipients can attend any accredited community, public, private or church-related college or university in Kansas.

To qualify, students must have at least a 3.5 grade point average. The student should be an active participant in school and community activities, display good citizenship, leadership and moral integrity and written and verbal skills.

Students must register at their schools and take the qualifying test. Tentative test dates are Thursday and Friday, Sept. 22 and 23.

The foundation also offers 90 Vocational Education scholarships of \$1,500 (non-renewable) to high school seniors. Students must complete an application form, available from their high school counselor or principal.

The scholarship committee will be interested in the student's character, activities, goals and six-semester grades. There is no test or grade requirement.

The foundation will also award 15 Community College Scholarships of \$2,000 each for Kansas community college graduates who plan to continue their education at a four-year Kansas college.

Applicants must be former graduates of a high school in one of the 26 northwest Kansas counties, have completed college work with a 3.00 grade point average or better and possess good character and leadership qualities.
