

Cowgirls tie for third at home tennis tourney

The Cowgirls tennis team finished in a tie for third place with Colby at Tuesday's Goodland Varsity Invitational.

The tournament's field of eight teams was divided into two pools, with both singles and No. 1 doubles being played at Steever Park and No. 2 doubles at Chambers Park. Each match consisted of one seven-game set, playing a tie-breaker at 6-all if needed.

Leading Goodland was the Cowgirls' No. 1 doubles team of juniors Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson, who placed third. The duo went 2-1 in pool play, defeating Ulysses 7-5 and Garden City 7-1. They lost to Brooke Boulware and Baylee Hess of Scott City 7-5.

McCall and Johnson then defeated Kaylie Dugger and Rashaun Wilson of Colby 7-1 for third place. Scott City defeated Greeley County

High 7-3 for first.

Junior Jillian Parker went 2-1 in pool play at No. 1 singles, defeating opponents from Ulysses 7-2 and from Garden City 7-1. She lost to Scott City's Miranda Appel 7-4.

Parker lost to Leanna Newcomer of Trego Community High in Wakeeney 7-2, finishing fourth. Celine Govert of Tribune defeated Appel 7-1 for first.

Seniors Megan Stefan and Kali Rietcheck went 1-2 in pool play at No. 2 doubles, losing to Ulysses 7-5, defeating Garden City 7-4 and then losing to Scott City 7-6 (7-5). The Cowgirls defeated Norton's Gena Myers and Sara Campbell 7-1 for fifth place.

Colby's Stephanie Albers and Lindsey Wilson defeated Amanda Murphy and Kelsey Tankersley of Scott City to earn the gold medal at No. 2 doubles.

Goodland freshman Shonna Webster, playing in her first varsity competition, went 0-3 in pool play at No. 2 singles but came back to defeat an opponent from Greeley County 7-3 to finish seventh.

Cassie Dietz of Trego Community defeated Resa Dowell of Ulysses 7-3 for first place.

The Lady Beavers of Scott City won the tournament, scoring 28 points with Greeley County finishing second at 22. Goodland and Colby scored 21. Norton and Trego Community tied for fifth with 20 points, Ulysses was seventh with 18 and Garden City eighth with seven.

Goodland will be the site of a junior varsity tournament starting at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Steever Park. The Cowgirls varsity travels to Garden City the following Saturday for a tournament starting at 8 a.m. Mountain Time.

Volleyball wins two in Leoti

The Cowgirls volleyball team won two of its three matches Tuesday at a quadrangular meet at Wichita County High School in Leoti.

In its first match, Goodland defeated the host team Wichita County 25-22, 25-16. In their second match, the Cowgirls fell to Lakin High 25-8, 25-13. Goodland got back on the winning trail against Scott City, beating the Lady Beavers 25-21, 25-18.

Scott City and Lakin, along with Goodland, all finished 2-1 for the tournament while Wichita County went 0-3.

The Cowgirls are now 7-4 for the season. At the Overland Volleyball Clas-

sic last Saturday in Aurora, Colo., Goodland's varsity went 3-2, winning the Division III bracket.

The 16 teams were divided into four pools, and the top team from each pool moved on to the championship round. The four second-place teams then competed for the Division II crown with the third- and fourth-place teams battling for their respective titles.

After going 1-2 in pool play, the Cowgirls defeated Gateway High 29-27, 25-18 in the Division III semifinals and beat Faith Christian High 20-25, 25-22 and 15-11 in the final.

Goodland's junior varsity went 2-1 Tuesday in Leoti, defeating both Lakin and Wichita County but fall-

ing to Scott City.

The junior varsity also competed in a tournament in Colorado last Saturday at Bishop Machebeuf Catholic High in Denver.

Cowgirls coach Jerry McKee said the girls played very well considering it was a varsity tournament.

Goodland's junior varsity went 1-3 on the day with two of the matches going to three games.

The Cowgirls have a break from competition until next Thursday, when they travel to Dodge City for a quadrangular meet with the Lady Demons along with Holcomb and Ulysses. The junior varsity and "C" teams will play there as well.

The "C" team travels to Oberlin Saturday for a freshman tourney.

Grant runners compete in Tribune

Other Mustangs running were Chase Sawatzky and Lee Prine.

The next meet for Grant's girls and boys will be the Ogallala Invitational next Thursday in Nebraska.

Golfers finish fourth in Hays

The Goodland High girls golf team finished fourth at the Thomas More Prep-Marian Invitational on Monday at the Smoky Hill Country Club in Hays.

Sophomore Sammie Raymer led the team with a 32-over-par 103 for 18 holes, finishing fifth overall. Sophomore Eryn Toppliff shot 129, senior Julie Leiker 133 and junior Kerri Bellamy 135.

Junior Amber Webster and freshman Chelsie Gausman also played for the varsity in Hays, shooting 136 and 145 respectively.

Bailey Ponton of Minneapolis won the gold medal with an 87. Nicky Rohleder of Marian, the host team, was second with 99. Larned's Tara Farley

was third at 100, one stroke better than Megan Bailey of Hays High.

The Lady Indians of Hays won the team title with three players placing in the top 10. Their team score was 438. Larned was second with 458 and Thomas More Prep third with 460. Goodland shot 500.

Bennington High was fifth and Scott City sixth. Minneapolis, Russell and Trego Community high schools did not enter enough players for a team score.
