

Cowgirl runner wins two-mile at Oakley

Cowgirl freshman Brittaney Medrano won the junior varsity two-mile race at the Oakley Invitational last Tuesday, crossing the finish line in 14 minutes, 32 seconds. Medrano finished more than a minute ahead of Rachel Thomson of Ellis. Goodland freshman Cassie Cooper finished third in 16:15, four seconds behind Thomson. Goodland did not enter a runner in either the girls varsity or the boys junior varsity competition. Sophomore Dustin Pennington led the Cowboys, finishing 22nd in the boys varsity five-kilometer race

in 21:13. Senior Wanja Runkel finished in 21:39, and sophomores Cody Bussen and Chris Geeseke ran 22:07 and 29:52, respectively. The Colby Eagles took the team title, led by Josh Baden, who won the race in 18:03 and by Darren Sporing who finished second in 18:22. Ellis placed second and Wheatland High of Grainfield was third. Neither Goodland, Hoxie nor Oakley entered enough runners for a team score. Jessica Stephens of Colby won

the girls varsity race in 12:16. Aubrey Frederking of Ellis was second in 12:32 and Oakley's Holly Poe third in 12:41. Oakley won the team competition 27-28 over Colby. They were the only two schools to qualify for a team score. Goodland coach Don Smith split the team, with his more experienced runners competing at the Wamego Invitational on Sept. 10 and the rest of the team in Oakley last week. The runners hit the trail again at 3 p.m. today at the Bentwood Golf Course for the Ulysses Invitational. On Saturday, the team travels to Johnson City for the Stanton County Invitational.

Fort Hays State Tigers lose to Chadron State Eagles

The Tigers of Fort Hays State University got knocked off the winning path Saturday by the Eagles of Chadron State College 45-6 in Nebraska. The Tigers scored first on a 65-yard pass play early in the first quarter, but that was all the Eagles' defense would allow for the rest of the game. Chadron State took a 7-6 lead late in the first period then went on a scoring frenzy in the second to lead 29-6 at halftime. The Eagles scored a pair of field goals in the third quarter to make it 35-6, and a field goal and a touchdown in the fourth to make the final 45-6. This was Chadron State's first win of the season after suffering three straight losses while the Tigers fell to 1-3 after getting their first win last weekend. In other games around the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, Adams State College (Colo.) defeated Fort Lewis (Colo.) 27-23, the University of Nebraska at Kearney beat Western State College of

Colorado 37-12 and Mesa State College (Colo.) edged New Mexico Highlands University in a shootout 61-54. In non-conference action, the Colorado School of Mines fell to the University of South Dakota 44-41 in overtime. The Rocky Mountain's non-conference record for the season stands at 2-17. Next Saturday, Fort Hays State will play host to Adams State while Fort Lewis visits Western State. Chadron State will defend its home field against Colorado Mines and Nebraska-Kearney will try to keep its three-game win streak going, on the road, against New Mexico Highlands. Also on Saturday, the Mavericks of Mesa State will celebrate their homecoming with a non-conference matchup with Western New Mexico University.

Brewster volleyball team wins three at quad in Rawlins County

The Brewster High School volleyball team improved to 13-1 for the season Saturday, winning all three of its matches at the quadrangular meet at Rawlins County High in Atwood. The Lady Bulldogs defeated Dundy County High of Benkelman, Neb., 25-23, 26-24; Marywood High (Neb.) 25-14, 25-14; and

Rawlins County 25-22, 26-24. "We had some close matches," said Brewster coach Lynda McKee, "but were able to play hard at the end and come away with the wins. We did not attack the ball as aggressively as I would like to see, but played good enough defense to compensate." Senior Caitlin Rush led the Bull-

dogs with 16 kills, and junior Avery Schulz was close behind with 15. Senior Jalyn Reid had six kills and senior Kasie Stevenson had four. Rush and Reid were the assist leaders with 19 and 18. Brewster visits Cheylin High in Bird City for a triangular meet with

the host Cougars and the Bulldogs of Golden Plains High from Rexford. Brewster remained at No. 5 in Class 1A in last week's Kansas Volleyball Association poll. The Lady Wildcats of Wallace County High in Sharon Springs won both of their matches at an earlier triangular meet in Atwood held

last Tuesday. The Wildcats defeated Rawlins County 25-18, 25-16 and St. Francis 25-23, 25-20. Wallace County placed second at the Gove County Fall Classic on Sept. 10 with pool play in both Grinnell and Grainfield. The Wildcats went 3-0 in their pool, then defeated Wheatland

High of Grainfield 25-14, 25-16 in the semi-finals. In the championship match, the Sharon Springs team fell to Hoxie 25-19, 25-20. The next action for the Wildcats will be a quadrangular meet in Brewster next Tuesday.

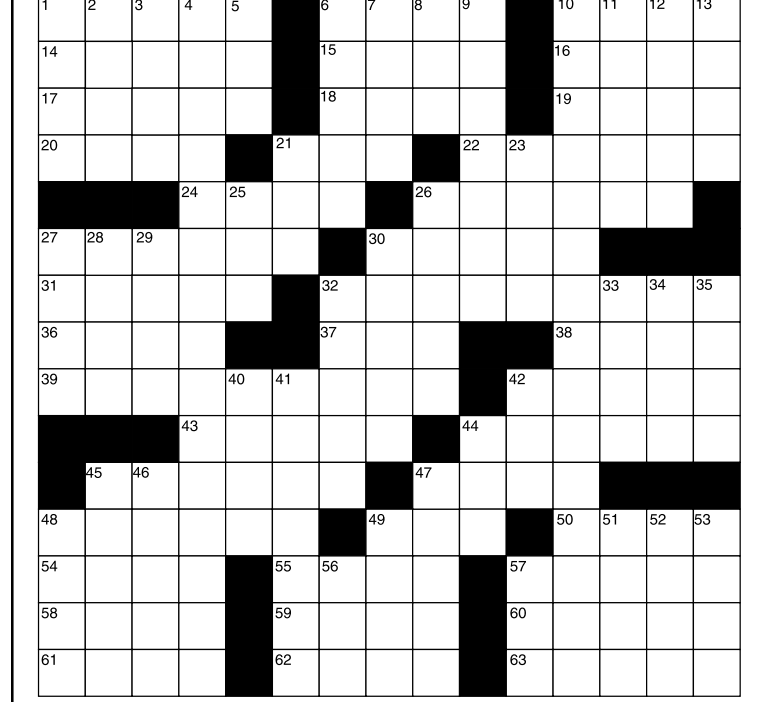
