Fresno State defeats Utah State

The Lady Bulldogs volleyball team of California State University, Fresno, defeated Utah State University Wednesday 3-2 to break a 10-game losing streak.

Former Cowgirl Alisha McKee, a sophomore middle blocker, is in her second season with the Bulldogs. McKee has started in seven of the 11 matches

she played in this season. She is fourth on the team in kills with 73 and second in blocks with 28.

McKee's most recent action was Monday when she started against Louisiana Tech University, playing in all four games of the Bulldogs 3-1 loss to the Techsters. She had 10 kills, four blocks and three digs.

Alisha, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, is the daughter of Jerry and Linda McKee of Goodland.

Fresno State, a NCAA Division I school, is now 3-11 for the season and 1-3 in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Bulldogs are in Honolulu today for a conference match against the University of Hawaii. Hawaii is ranked No. 11 in this week's poll by the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

Cowgirls win two at home quad meet

The Goodland High volleyball team won two of its three matches Tuesday at a home quadrangular meet at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowgirls started with a 26-24, 25-23 win over Rawlins County High of Atwood, then lost a tough three-game match to Decatur Community High of Oberlin 25-12, 16-25 and 25-21. Goodland came back in its final match of the meet to defeat Brewster 25-23, 25-17.

"Our passing and court coverage was improved," said Coach Jerry McKee. "We also showed a more balanced attacking game."

In the Cowgirls' first game against Rawlins County, the teams played even throughout, tying the score 11 times. With the count at 24, Goodland scored on a spike by senior Justeen Koehler for the sideout and a one-point lead. On the next play, the Lady Buffaloes could not return a serve by senior Jordan Frazier and the Cowgirls won 26-24.

In Goodland's second game against the Buffaloes, the teams again played even for most of the game. With the score tied at 22, junior Whitney Archer spiked the ball for a kill, followed by another point scored by senior Melissa Swager and the Cowgirls led 24-22.

A spike by Atwood's Sara Miller made the score 24-23 and gave the Buffaloes a side out. However, on the next play, Archer passed the ball deep into Atwood's court. The Buffaloes could not handle the ball, giving

Goodland the game 25-23 and the match 2-0.

After the score was tied at 7 in the Cowgirls' first game against Oberlin, the Red Devils scored eight straight points behind the serve of Lauren Fortin, building a 15-7 lead. Oberlin had a six-point run later in the game to make it 22-10, going on to win 25-12.

The momentum changed sides in the second game when, after the score was tied at 3, Swager went on a six-point serving run to give Goodland a 9-3 lead. Later, with Goodland leading 21-16, Frazier scored a point, giving the Cowgirls a sideout and sending Swager back to the service line.

A kill by Koehler and one by junior Emily Murray made the score 24-16. On the next play, Koehler tapped a low volley straight down on Oberlin's side of the net for game point.

In the third and deciding game, the teams played to a 20-all tie, then the Red Devils surged ahead, scoring five of the next six points to win 25-21 and take the match.

In Goodland's first game against Brewster, the teams played to a 5-all tie. Then Cowgirls scored eight of the next nine points for a 13-6 lead. Goodland later increased its lead to 20-10, then it was the Lady Bulldogs' turn for a scoring run, getting 11 of the next 14 to pull with two at 23-21.

A block by Swager and junior Lindsay Shields made it 24-21. A kill by Brewster's Avery Schultz gave the Bulldogs a sideout and got

them back within two at 24-22. Brewster scored the next point after a long volley, but a service error by the Bulldogs on the next play gave Goodland the win 25-23.

In their second game against Brewster, the Cowgirls built up an 8-1 early lead, going on to win 25-17. Four Goodland players had at least two kills each in the game.

Goodland is now 12-14 for the season and will hit the court again at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday for another home quadrangular meet with Oakley, Grinnell and Weskan high schools.

Brewster fell to 17-5 for the season after losing all three of its matches on Tuesday. The Bulldogs lost to Oberlin 25-16, 25-23 and to Atwood 20-25, 25-23 and 25-23 before dropping their match to Goodland.

"Playing these bigger schools is great competition for us," said Brewster coach Lynda McKee. "We're disappointed that we didn't come away with any wins, because we have the ability to beat any of them. Hopefully we'll learn from our mistakes and come away a better, more focused, more motivated team."

Oberlin finished the meet 3-0 while Atwood went 1-2.

"I thought the quad was a very competitive situation for all the teams involved," Jerry McKee said.

Brewster's next action will be Saturday at a tournament in Hill City. Other schools scheduled to compete there include Golden Plains, Ness City and Norton.

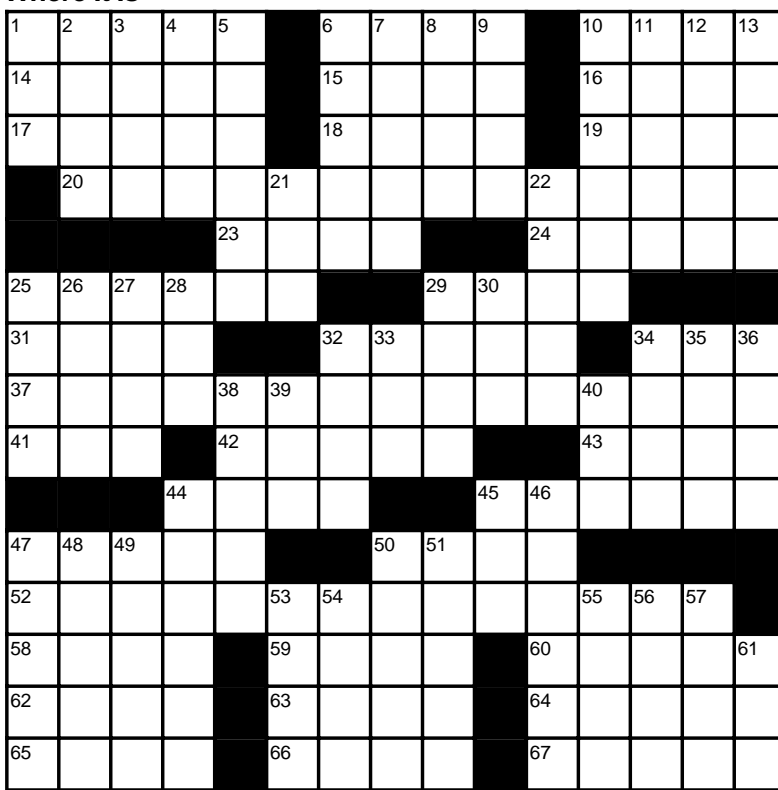
