Visiting Tigers maul Cowboys 42-7

The Ulysses Tigers dominated the Goodland High football team Friday night at Cowboy Stadium, jumping out to a 14-0 lead early and going on to win the game 42-7.

Ulysses improved to 5-1 for the season while the Cowboys fell to 3-3.

In the game's opening drive, the Tigers went 64 yards, scoring on a 16-yard keeper by quarterback Johnny Sosa to take a 7-0 lead.

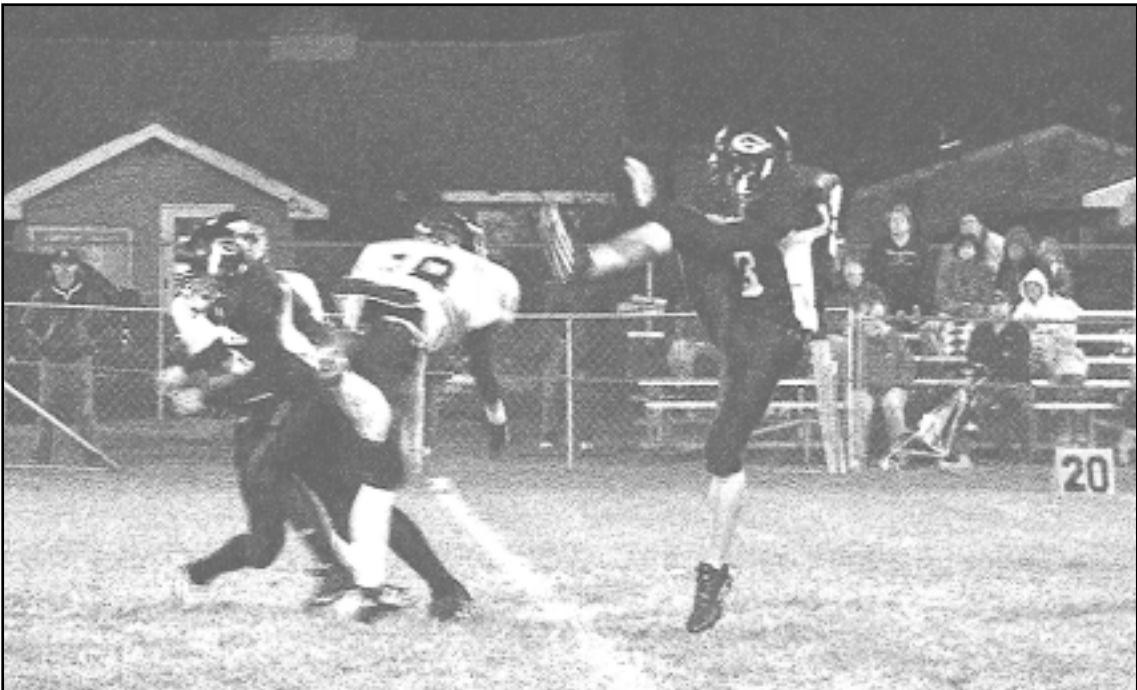
Seven plays later, the Cowboys fumbled the ball away, giving Ulysses a first-and-10 on the Goodland 49 yard line. After driving down to the 17, running back Skylar Morales broke through the left side for 17-yard touchdown run to make it 14-0 with about five minutes left in the first quarter.

On the Cowboys' next possession, the Ulysses defense forced Goodland to punt after three plays, but the Tigers' returner fumbled the ball. Cowboy sophomore Ren Scherling recovered and Goodland had a first-and-10 at the Ulysses 30.

Four plays later, senior running back Derek Fenner plunged in from one yard out to put the Cowboys on the scoreboard. Scherling kicked the extra point to make the score 14-7 with a minute left in the first period.

However, that was all the points Goodland would get, as Ulysses added a touchdown each in the second and third quarters, and scored two more in the fourth to make the final 42-7.

"I thought we played pretty good in the first half," said Goodland coach Jon McLean, "but their speed

and quickness took over in the second half."

McLean said although the Cowboys made a few too many mistakes the team played hard and he was proud of that.

The Tigers outgained Goodland 446 yards to 173, and had the edge in first downs 13 to 10.

There were nine turnovers in the game, five by Goodland and four by Ulysses, including back-to-back interceptions halfway through the second quarter. The Cowboys were penalized seven times for 55 yards and the Tigers 14 times for 115.

After Morales returned the open-

ing kickoff 26 yards to the Tigers' 36, Ulysses took eight plays to go 64 yards, scoring on Sosa's 16-yard keeper around the right end. Mark Ochoa kicked the first of his six extra points of the night to make the score 7-0.

The subsequent kickoff went out of bounds, giving the Cowboys a first-and-10 on their own 35. However, after driving 20 yards to the Ulysses 45, Goodland fumbled the ball away.

Starting on the Goodland 49, the Tigers again took eight plays to get to the end zone, with Morales scoring on a 17-yard run for a 14-0

Ulysses lead.

The Cowboys could not get going on their next possession and were forced to punt, but Morales fumbled the ball on the return. Two plays later, sophomore quarterback Nathan Linin hit senior Bob Miller for a 15-yard pass, giving the Cowboys first-and-goal at the 1. Fenner scored on the next play, and with the extra point, the score was 14-7.

The Tigers' next possession stalled and they were forced to punt. Goodland's subsequent possession also stalled, but Goodland's punt hit the back of a Cowboy trying to block resulting in a short kick giv-

The Broncbusters of Garden City Community College upset Coffeyville Community College 25-21 on Saturday.

With the win, Garden City improved to 5-2 overall and 5-1 in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. The Broncbusters play host to the Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College on Saturday.

The Red Ravens of Coffeyville, after their first loss of the season, also are now 5-1 in the conference

and 6-1 overall. For the last two weeks, Coffeyville had been ranked No. 2 by the National Junior College Athletic Association.

The Red Ravens go on the road to face top-ranked Butler County Community College on Saturday.

Butler County beat Independence Community College this weekend 57-3. The Grizzlies are now 7-0 overall and 6-0 in the conference.

In other games around the conference Saturday, Dodge City defeated

Fort Scott 27-20 and Hutchinson beat Highland Community College 48-14.

Next weekend, Dodge City visits Highland and Independence visits Fort Scott.

The conference playoffs begin Saturday, Oct. 23. Butler County is the defending conference champion and was the national runner-up last season, finishing with an 11-1 overall record.

ing Ulysses a first down just 23 yards from the end zone.

Six plays later, Morales scored his second touchdown from three yards out, increasing the Tigers' lead to 20-7. Penalties after the touchdown forced Ochoa to kick a 40-yard extra point, but he split the uprights, making it 21-7.

An interception stopped the Cowboys' next possession, but on the very next play senior Heath Chatfield intercepted a Tiger pass, giving the ball back to Goodland. However, the Cowboys could not make any progress and were forced to punt four plays later.

The last 90 seconds of the first half were highlighted by three turnovers within six plays and the gun sounded with Ulysses leading 21-7.

Goodland had three possessions in the third quarter, with the first two ending on punts and the third on downs after a fourth-down pass fell incomplete. Ulysses scored on its first possession of the second half on a 23-yard touchdown run by running back Trent Wieland which capped an eight-play, 68-yard drive by the Tigers.

An interception by the Tigers' Trevor Alexander stopped Goodland's first possession of the fourth quarter, and five plays later Sosa caught a pass from running back Vincent Orosco for a 46-yard touch-

down making it 35-7.

Ulysses scored again on a 26-yard run by Andrew Anderson less than three minutes later, increasing the Tigers' lead to 42-7.

Goodland was able to mount a drive that covered 53 yards but came up a yard short on a fourth-down conversion and Ulysses took over. The Tigers picked up two first downs to run the clock out.

Fenner was Goodland's leading rusher picking up 61 yards on 20 carries. Sophomore Casey Henderson ran 11 times for 53 yards, Miller six times for 27 and Linin five times for seven.

Linin completed two of nine passes for 23 yards and was intercepted three times. Miller caught one pass for 15 yards and junior Jerrod Goodman the other for eight.

Sophomore Jake Kling led the Cowboys defense with 13 tackles including five unassisted. Fenner recorded 11 tackles also with five unassisted. Senior Brandon Tatman and sophomore Tanner Smith both had eight tackles.

Goodland begins district play on Friday against Clay Center Community High in Cowboy Stadium, the final home game of the regular season. The Tigers of Clay Center are 2-4 after losing to Wamego High 17-12 this weekend.
