

# Cowboy gets third win of season; Goodland places fourth at Lakin

Junior Kerek Mason won his third race of the season Saturday, helping Goodland finish fourth at the Lakin Invitational at Louck's Park Municipal Golf Course.

Mason ran first in the boys junior-senior division race, finishing the five-kilometer course in 16 minutes 34 seconds. Goodland senior Wanja Runkel finished 32nd in 20:52.

Senior Tiffany Thomas led the Cowgirls, finishing seventh in the junior-senior girls two-mile race in 13:23. Junior Whitney Dautel was eighth, just nine seconds behind Thomas. Senior Kalie Smith finished 13th in 14:07.

"Kerek's time was outstanding," said Coach Don Smith, "and he ran a smart race. The junior and senior girls ran very, very well."

Sophomore Toby Hurst led the Cowboys in the freshman-sophomore boys race, finishing ninth in 18:48. Sophomore Dustin Pennington was 21st in 19:39. Sophomores Cody Bussen was 40th in 22:40 and sophomore Chris Geeseka was 45th in 28:01.

Freshman Brittane Medrano placed ninth in the freshman-sophomore girls race, running the course in 14:36. Freshman Cassie Cooper was 19th in 15:25.

Coach Smith said this was Goodland's best team performance of the year, with several runners getting their season-best times.

Two Cowboys and five Cowgirls earned medals for finishing among the top 20 in their races.

The results of the four races were consolidated for one team score, with the Colby High School scoring 30 points to win the meet. The Eagles were led by Jessica Stephens, who won the junior-senior girls race in 12:20, and Josh Baden, who won the freshman-sophomore boys race in 17:48.

Scott City finished second in the team competition with 45 points and Oakley was third with 58. Goodland scored 66. Ulysses was fifth with 68 points, and both Lakin and Hugoton scored 78. Syracuse was eighth with 78, followed by Syracuse (78) and Garden City's junior varsity (105).

Vivian Olvera of Southwestern Heights High of Kismet won the freshman-sophomore girls race in 12:54. Southwestern Heights was one of four schools which had runners competing but did not qualify for a team score.

The Cowboys and Cowgirls hit the trail again at 10 a.m. (Mountain Time) Saturday at the golf course in

The Brewster High School volleyball team won all five of its matches at the Hill City Tournament on Saturday, improving to 22-5 for the season.

The Lady Bulldogs defeated LaCrosse High 25-23, 25-20; Trego Community High of WaKeeney 23-25, 27-25 and 25-9; Golden Plains

High of Rexford 27-25, 25-17; Ness City High 25-9, 25-11; and Northern Valley High of Almena 25-2, 25-22.

"We played well throughout the day," said Coach Lynda McKee. "We had some close matches, but were able to pick up our intensity, play hard to the end and come away

with the wins. It was a great team effort."

Senior Caitlin Rush led the Bulldogs in kills with 39 for the tournament. Junior Averu Schultz had 33 kills, senior Kasie Stevenson 12 and senior Jalyn Reid nine. Reid and freshman Brittany Kammer led the team in service aces with seven

each, followed by Stevenson with six.

Brewster is in Atwood this afternoon for a triangular meet with Hoxie and the host Rawlins County. The Western Kansas Liberty League tournament begins at 10 a.m. (Central Time) Saturday in Brewster.

# Fort Hays State falls to Fort Lewis 51-20

Three football teams in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference added a victory to their homecoming celebrations Saturday.

The Skyhawks of Fort Lewis College (Colo.) capped homecoming in Durango with a 51-20 win over Fort Hays State University.

The Tigers took an early 10-0 lead but Fort Lewis came back with a pair of long pass plays for touchdowns to lead 14-10 after the first quarter. The Skyhawks kept the momentum, scoring 20 unanswered points in the second period to take a 34-10 half-time lead.

Fort Hays State made it 34-17 about six minutes into the third quarter, but Fort Lewis responded with two more touchdowns to increase its lead to 48-17 going into the fourth.

In the final period, the teams exchanged 47-yard field goals to make the final 51-20.

Fort Lewis improved to 4-2 for the season while the Tigers fell to 2-5. Fort Hays is off this coming weekend while the Skyhawks travel to Golden to face the Colorado School of Mines.

Chadron State College (Neb.)

won its homecoming game on Saturday against Mesa State College (Colo.) 36-24. The Eagles, now 2-5 for the season, play host to the University of Nebraska at Kearney this weekend. Mesa State, also 2-5, visits Adams State College in Alamosa, Colo.

The Grizzlies of Adams State beat New Mexico Highlands University 50-18 in front of a homecoming crowd, improving to 3-4 for the season. New Mexico Highlands fell to 1-6 and will visit Western State College in Gunnison, Colo., on Saturday.

In other games around the conference Saturday, the Orediggers of Colorado Mines fell to 3-4 after losing at home to Nebraska-Kearney 35-24 and Western State lost on the road to Western New Mexico University 29-22 in a non-conference match up.

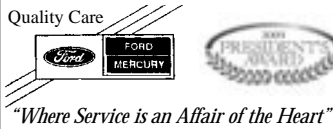
