

Cowgirl golf team going to state championship

The Cowgirls golf team won its regional tournament this past Monday at the Big Creek Golf Club in WaKeeney, earning its first trip to the state tournament, which will be Monday at the Terradyne Country Club in Andover.

"I am very proud of the girls' performance, considering the weather," said Coach Connie Livengood. "All the teams were in the same situation, and it came down to who wanted to do the best. What I am most proud of is that we stayed together as a team."

Sophomore Sammie Raymer led Goodland to the championship plaque with a 13-over-par 48, placing third. Freshman Chelsie Gausman shot a 54, finishing eighth. "I felt that Chelsie did an out-

standing job, as she is a freshman going into a regional tournament, which sometimes intimidates underclassmen," Livengood said. "She held her own and medaled, and that is not bad for a freshman. "Sammie did a fine job also, coming in third among a good group of golfers."

Junior Brooke Whitmore shot a 58 to finish 13th and senior Julie Leiker shot a 62 for 21st. Others

competing for Goodland were sophomore Eryn Topliff (64 for 25th) and junior Amber Webster (68 for 30th).

"Brooke and Julie did fine, and Eryn and Amber hung in there," said Livengood, "so I really got to give all of the team compliments."

Forty-one golfers from nine schools competed in the tournament, with the top 10 players earning medals. The top two teams at

each of the six regionals advance to the state tournament. The top five players at each tourney who were not members of the top two teams also qualify for state.

Last season, the Cowgirls placed fifth at the regional tournament which was played at the Bentwood Golf Course in Ulysses.

Monday's tournament was cut back from 18 holes to nine due to the rain.

"The weather did not ever let up," Livengood said, "and after nine holes of continuous rain, the girls were drenched and cold, and the coaches voted to quit after nine."

As a team, the Cowgirls scored 222, just one stroke better than the Lady Panthers of Concordia, who also advance to the state tournament.

The Panthers were led by Haley Funk, who won the tournament with a 5-over-par 40. Bailey Ponton of Minneapolis was second, shooting a 45, and advances to state as an individual.

"Terradyne is a tremendous course," Coach Livengood said. "It has a lot more water than our Sugar Hills and the rough is like a jungle. We will know more about it once we play our practice round."

She said the total distance for the course is seven yards less than Sugar Hills, but its has "double greens," big enough to hold the flags for two separate holes.

The Goodland Ambassadors will give the team a send-off around 3:30 this afternoon at the high school. The team will leave Goodland around 5 a.m. Sunday.

"As this is our first trip to state as a team, I'm really excited for the girls," Livengood said. "It will be a good experience for them to see where they are as a team and as individuals compared to the rest of the girls in Kansas.

"I want to thank my assistant, Jackie Elliott, for helping with the team this season. She has been a tremendous help to me the past two years."

Broncbusters make top 20

The Garden City Community College football team re-entered the National Junior College Athletic Association's top 20 poll this week at No. 15 after a 25-21 win over previously undefeated Coffeyville Community College last Saturday.

The Broncbusters improved to 5-2. The Red Ravens, now 6-1, spent the past two weeks ranked No. 2 in the poll but dropped to No. 10 this week.

Two freshman players on Garden City's roster are former Goodland Cowboys. Derrick Raymer is the team's punter and David Livengood ia a backup tailback and plays on special teams.

Garden City was ranked No. 11

with a 2-0 record in the first poll of the season but fell out after a 22-19 loss to Cisco Junior College (Texas).

After the first quarter of Saturday's game Coffeyville held a 7-0 lead. Garden City got on the scoreboard on the final play of the first half with a 37-yard field goal.

The Broncbusters took a 10-7 lead with about four minutes left in the third period on an 18-yard touchdown pass. However, the Red Ravens responded with a pair of touchdowns in the first eight minutes of the fourth quarter for a 21-10 lead.

Garden City came back with a touchdown with 4:40 on the clock and with the two-point conversion

made the score 21-18. The 'Busters got the ball back and with 96 seconds left, scored on a 32-yard pass play to go ahead 25-21.

Both teams are now 5-1 in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. Garden City faces the visiting Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College Saturday while Coffeyville travels to Ed Dorado to take on Butler County Community College, the nation's top-ranked team.

Saturday marks the end of the regular season for the teams of the Kansas Jayhawk conference. Conference playoffs begin the following weekend, with the championship game scheduled for Sunday, Nov. 6.

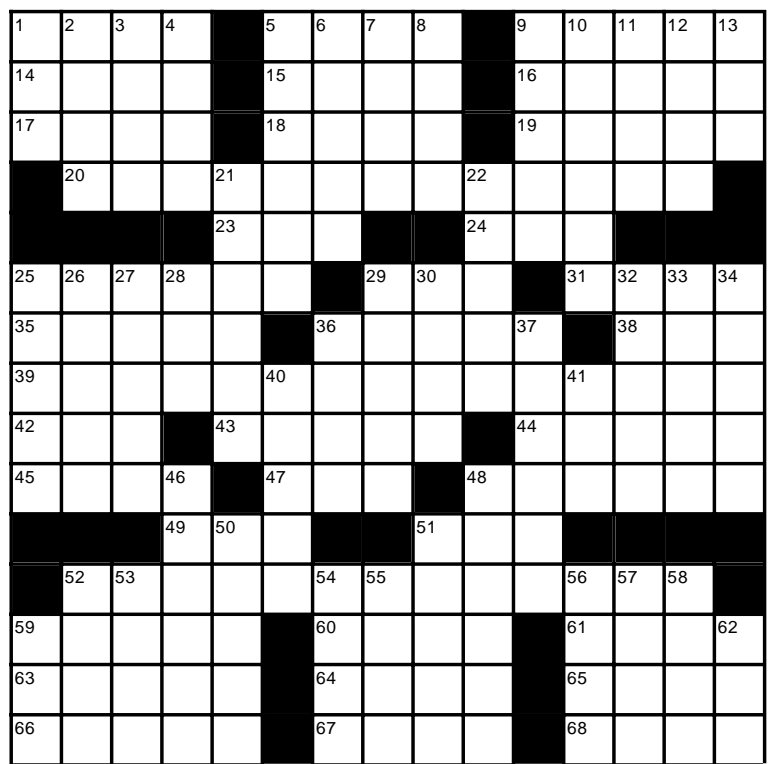


Crossword Puzzle

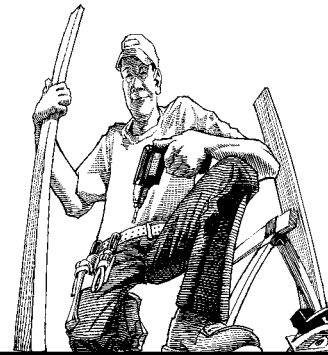
