

Cowboys goal district win; face Panthers

The Goodland Cowboys will be out to break a three-game losing streak tonight against the Panthers in Concordia.

Both the Cowboys and the Panthers are 3-4 for the season, but Concordia won its district opener last Friday against Colby 54-28 while Goodland fell to Clay Center 53-14. The Cowboys will have to beat Concordia tonight and Colby next Thursday, plus have Clay Center win against the Panthers next Friday in order to make the state playoffs.

"Concordia has a very tough offense with speed," said Cowboy coach Jon McLean, "and they are very good at mixing up the run and the pass. They have a very good quarterback and tailback, and have good receivers."

McLean said because a lot of the Panther players who play both ways, the Cowboys offense will be facing defenders with good speed.

However, Concordia has given up 27 or more points in five of its last six games. The one exception was two weeks ago when the Panthers lost to Abilene 15-13.

McLean said three of his players are questionable for tonight's game. Senior quarterback Wyatt Dautel is recovering from a mild concussion and has been having shoulder problems. Both senior Jon Beeson and sophomore T.J. Hawkins are on the maybe list due to knee injuries.

Senior Brandon Tatman, who missed last Friday's game due to an injury, may see limited action to-

night if he gets his doctor's clearance in time.

Concordia's senior running back Rocky Anderson rushed for 271 yards on 10 carries and four touchdowns against Colby. He was followed by senior Chris Kearn who had 74 yards on 10 rushes and junior Randall Whitley carried for 62 yards on eight rushes. Junior quarterback Bryant Johnson passed for 87 yards connecting on 5 of 9 passes with 1 interception. Senior tight end Chad Palmquist caught 3 passes for 61 yards and two were for touchdowns against Colby.

The Cowboys end the regular season on the road Thursday against the Colby Eagles. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. (Mountain Time).

Brewster wins league title, Wildcats win regional

The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster won the Western Kansas Liberty League volleyball tournament Saturday, defeating Wallace County High in the championship match 22-25, 25-17 and 25-19.

The Wildcats turned the tables on the Brewster girls Tuesday, though, beating the Lady Bulldogs in the finals of the Class 1A regional tournament in Sharon Springs. Both teams advance to the substate tournament Saturday in Ransom, however.

In league pool play Saturday, Brewster started off with a 25-20, 25-23 win over Healy, but lost its next match to Grinnell 25-23, 27-25. The Bulldogs regrouped and beat Golden Plains High of Rexford 25-21, 25-16, earning them a spot in the semifinals.

Brewster needed three games to defeat Wheatland High of Grainfield 25-23, 25-25 and 25-21, and advance to the champi-

onship match against the Lady Wildcats from Sharon Springs. The Wildcats bested Grinnell in the other semi-final match.

"We struggled in the first two matches, making too many unforced errors and not playing well on defense," Brewster coach Lynda McKee said. "We played much better as a team the last three matches and were successful because of it. From here on out we need to play well every game, or our season will be over."

At Tuesday's regional tournament, both Brewster and Wallace County had first-round byes. In the second round, the Bulldogs defeated Weskan 25-16, 25-13 and the Wildcats beat Greeley County High of Tribune 25-16, 25-17.

Wallace County then beat Brewster 16-25, 25-21 and 25-17 in the final. Both teams advance to the substate tournament on Saturday at Western Plains High School in Ransom.

Tennis player 1-2 at state meet

Goodland High Junior Jillian Parker went 1-2 in singles at the state Class 4A tennis championships last weekend at the Kossover Tennis Complex in Topeka.

In the first round, Parker took on junior Kate LaForge of Parsons, who won the regional tournament in Independence on Oct. 10. Parker fell to LaForge in straight sets 6-1, 6-0. LaForge advanced all the way to the state championship match but lost to Alex O'Neal, a sophomore at

Topeka's Hayden High, 6-3, 6-1.

In the back bracket, Parker won her next match, beating sophomore Kristin McKee of Andover 9-1. Parker then faced Wamego junior Becca Law in the next round, losing 9-1.

Parker finished her season 21-13, her third as a Cowgirl.

Sophomore Logan Wark of Colby went 3-2 at the state tournament, placing ninth, while her teammate, senior Rachel Funk, finished 0-2.

Volleyball team faces tough road in Ulysses

The Goodland High School volleyball team will travel to Ulysses on Saturday for the state Class 4A substate tournament.

Goodland will face Pratt (18-14) in the first round. Pratt (18-14) is seeded third while the Cowgirls are seeded sixth in the tournament. The opening round matches will begin at 2 p.m. Central Time.

There will be eight substate tournaments in Class 4A, each with eight teams. Joining Goodland and host Ulysses are Colby, Hugoton, Larned, Pratt, Scott City and Thomas More Prep-Marian.

The tournament bracket is set up to use two courts and the Cowgirls will be in the second match on the west court. The other match will have Thomas More Prep (20-10) facing Larned (11-20). The Colby Eagles (25-5) are the top seed, and

will face Ulysses (5-23) in the first match on the east court. Scott City (18-16) will face Hugoton (15-17) in the second match on the east court.

The Cowgirls have already played four of those teams at least once during the regular season, resulting in a 2-4 record. Goodland won its match against Ulysses on Sept. 22 at the quadrangular meet in Dodge City and split against Scott City, winning on Sept. 13 at the Wichita County quad meet then losing to the Lady Beavers 11 days later in Scott City.

The Cowgirls lost to Marian in their first match of the season on Sept. 6 in Goodland, and dropped both of their matches to Colby first on Sept. 24 in Scott City and on Oct. 1 in Oakley.

Goodland is now 15-17 after go-

ing 1-2 at the Northwest Kansas League tournament last Saturday in Quinter.

"I like the position we have in the tournament," said Cowgirl Coach Jerry McKee. "We will need to play well to get through. There does not appear to be a real favorite."

"Pratt, our first opponent, have won their league tournament. They appear to have good size and several returning players from last year."

Six seniors are playing in their

final Cowgirl volleyball season: Jordan Frazier, Chelsea Gray, Justeen Koehler, Melissa Swager, Lisha Tedford and Morgan Titus.

Junior players expected to make the trip to Ulysses along with the six seniors are Whitney Archer, Kaylee Billinger, Amber Cowan, Emily Murray, Lindsay Schields and Shandel Simon.

The winning teams from each of the eight regionals will advance to the state tournament on Oct. 28-29 at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

Golfers finish 12th at state

The Goodland Cowgirls finished 12th at the class 4-3-2-1A state golf tournament Monday at the Teradyne Country Club in Andover.

Sophomore Sammie Raymer led the team with a round of 108 on the 18-hole, par-71 course. Freshman Chelsie Gausman shot a 112 and sophomore Eryn Topliff a 125. Juniors Brooke Whitmore and Amber Webster shot 127 and 132, and se-

nior Julie Leiker had a 142.

The Lady Trojans of Andover won the state team title, led by Katy Nugent, who won the individual championship with a 6-over-par 77. The Trojans' team score was 354. Andover's Central High was second with 370 and Girard High was third with 393. Ulysses placed fourth with 402. Goodland's score was 473.
