Goodland runner heads to state meet

A Goodland Cowboy will be among the runners competing at the state Class 4A cross country championship meet Saturday at the country club in Wamego.

Junior Kerek Mason qualified for the state meet by placing third at Saturday's 4A regional race in Buhler. Mason ran the five-kilometer course in 16 minutes, 30 seconds. This will be Mason's second straight state appearance.

Other Cowboys competing at the regional meet were sophomores Toby Hurst and Dustin Pennington, and senior Wanja Runkel. Hurst finished 60th in 19:12, Pennington 65th in 19:30 and Runkel 75th in 20:19.

Coach Don Smith said Mason, Pennington and Runkel all had their best times of the season in Buhler, while Hurst missed his best by just one second.

Cole Ginther of Thomas More Prep-Marian High of Hays won the boys race in 15:42. The boys of Abilene High School won the team competition scoring 46 points. Wamego High was second with 69 and the host Buhler third with 110. Eighty-five boys from 14 schools ran in the meet.

Colby finished seventh with 159

points. Goodland, with only four runners, did not qualify for a team score.

Senior Tiffany Thomas led the Cowgirls' effort, finishing the two-mile course in 13:05 to place 22nd. Junior Whitney Dautel finished just seven seconds behind Thomas for 26th. Freshman Brittaney Medrano ran a 14:25 for 50th, and freshman Cassie Cooper ran 14:55 for 65th.

Smith said Thomas, Dautel and Cooper all ran their best two-mile races of the season. This was Thomas' final race of her high school career after four seasons running for the Cowgirls.

"It was a nice way for the girls to finish their season," he said.

Like the boys, the Cowgirls did not have enough runners for a team score.

Colby senior Jessica Stephens earned the gold medal, winning the race in 11:44 to lead the Lady Eagles to a third-place finish. Buhler won the team title with 51 points, followed by Wamego with 61. There were 80 girls in the race.

The top three teams, girls and boys, advance to the state meet.

At the state meet, the Class 4A girls race begins at 11:30 a.m. (Central Time) and the boys at 12:30.

Garden City faces Coffeyville in conference semi-final game

The top four seeds all won their games Sunday in the first round of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference football playoffs.

The Grizzlies of Butler County Community College beat Fort Scott Community College 57-0 in El Dorado. The Grizzlies have been the National Junior College Athletic Association's top-ranked team since Sept. 6.

Garden City Community College defeated Highland Community College 49-7 Sunday. The Broncbusters rose four spots to No. 11 in last week's national junior college poll.

Freshman punter Derrick Raymer, a 2005 graduate of Goodland High, went into Sunday's game averaging over 38 yards per kick for the Broncbusters.

Coffeyville Community College defeated Independence Community College 27-7. The Red Ravens were ranked No. 17 in last week's poll.

The Conquistadors of Dodge City Community College beat the Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College 57-14.

Going into Sunday's game, Hutchinson wide receiver Jared Duke had four receptions for 66 yards. Duke, who was a backup

quarterback last year, is a 2004 graduate of Goodland High.

The conference semi-finals will be this coming Sunday, with Dodge City traveling to El Dorado to face Butler County and Coffeyville heading to Garden City.

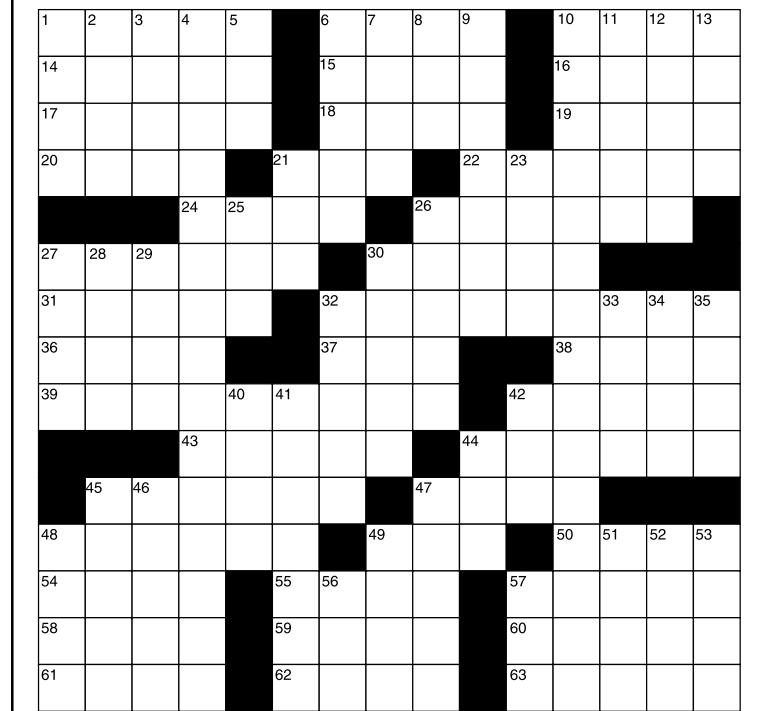
The Broncbusters-Red Ravens game can be heard on Garden City radio KSKL (94.5 FM), with the pregame show starting around noon (Mountain Time).
