Veterans Day had it beginnings in 'War to end all Wars'

A memorial on a hillside overlooking the Potomac River and the city of Washington has become the focal point for remembrance for America's veterans.

It started when an unknown soldier from World War I was buried in Arlington National Cemetery in 1921.

England and France had similar ceremonies. In France, the soldier was buried at the Arc de Triomphe, and in England at Westminster Abbey. The ceremonies took place on Nov. 11, recognizing the end of World War I at 11 a.m. Nov. 11, 1918 — the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Nov. 11 became known as "Armistice Day."

A congressional resolution in 1926 officially designated Armistice Day. Nov. 11 became a national holiday in 1938. The

hope that World War I was "the War to end all Wars" never materialized, though. World War II started only a few years later. 16,500,000 Americans took part in that war, and 407,000 died in the service, 292,000 in battle.

In 1954, President Eisenhower signed a bill turning Nov. 11 into Veteran's Day honoring all who served America in time of war.

On Memorial Day 1958, two more American war dead were brought from overseas and buried in the plaza beside the unknown soldier from World War I. These burials honored World War II and Korean veterans.

In 1984, an unknown serviceman from the Vietnam War was placed along side the

others.

An Army honor guard from the 3rd Infantry (The Old Guard) keeps vigil day and night at the tombs.

In 1968, Congress moved Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. It soon became apparent that November 11 had historical significance to a lot of people, though, so in 1978 Congress moved Veterans Day back to Nov. 11.

The national ceremonies for Veterans Day will be 11 a.m. Friday at the memorial amphitheater built around the Tomb of the Unknowns.

A combined color guard from all the military services will execute "Present Arms" at the tomb. A presidential wreath will be placed, and "Taps" played.

Veterans plan observance here

The local winner of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Voice of Democracy oratory contest, Michael Smith, will deliver his speech on Veterans Day at the VFW ceremony at the post hall, 824 Main.

The ceremony will begin at the "11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month," 11 a.m. on Friday, Nov. 11. The public is invited.

The contest required students to enter a 3-5 minute taped speech on the theme "How I Demonstrate my Freedom." Stu-

dents in grades 9-12 were eligible to participate. The local winner goes on to compete at the state and national level, competing for more than \$250,000 in scholarships.

Smith won the contest at the local and district level last year. Aaron Duell placed second in the local contest this year.

The Patriot's Pen is an essay contest for 6th to 8th grade students sponsored by the veterans' group. The topic was "Who are

Today's Patriots?" The local winner will go on to state and national. The first place national winner gets a \$10,000 scholarship award. The local winners were picked on November 2.



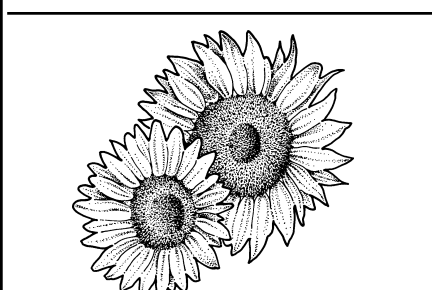

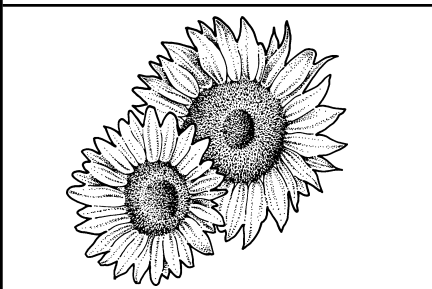
