Eight Cowboys named to all-league team

Eight Goodland High football players were named to the Northwest Kansas League's 2005 all-league team last week, with three earning honors on both offense and defense.

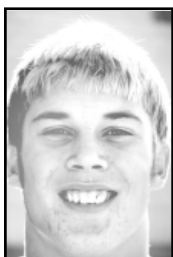
Senior Mark Starr made the first team as a defensive lineman and the second team as an offensive tackle, just as he did last season.

"Mark has been a solid lineman for us," said Cowboys coach Jon McLean. "He has made the all-league team since his sophomore year."

As a defensive lineman, Starr made 51 tackles including a quarterback sack and recovered two fumbles.

In 2003, as a sophomore, Starr was a first-team pick in both positions.

Senior Jase Herl earned first-

team honors as both a wide receiver and defensive back. He was a second-team pick in 2004 as a defensive back.

Herl led the Cowboys is receptions this season with 15, gaining 275 yards and scoring a touchdown. On defense, he was the team's second-leading tackler with 66 and a fumble recovery.

"Jase has always had good hands," McLean said. "As our safety, he did a very good job as our defensive quarterback."

Senior Derek Fenner was the Cowboys' leading tackler and their leading rusher, earning him first-team honors at linebacker and second-team at running back.

"Derek had an excellent season for us," said McLean. "When we moved him to fullback and linebacker, it made our team better."

Fenner recorded 70 tackles, 20 solo, and three quarterback sacks.

As a running back, Fenner rushed for 805 yards on 164 carries, averaging nearly five yards per carry. He

scored 11 rushing touchdowns and ran for a pair of two-point conversions. Fenner also caught three passes for 127 yards and two touchdowns.

Senior Bob Miller earned honorable mention as a running back. Miller rushed for 539 yards on 93 carries and scored four touchdowns. He caught two passes for another 26 yards.

"It was great for Bob to be back playing again for the Cowboys," McLean said. "He was second on

the team in rushing."

Miller earned honorable mention at running back as a sophomore in the 2003 season.

Seniors Heath Chatfield and Wyatt Dautel both received honorable mention as defensive backs. Chatfield made 36 tackles for the Cowboys and had two of their four interceptions. Dautel had 25 tackles, 11 solo. Both players were out part of this season because of injuries.

"It really hurt our team when Heath got hurt," McLean said. "He was a solid receiver and cornerback for us."

"Wyatt had to battle injuries all season long. I know he would have been more productive without his injury situation."

Junior John Mosbarger earned honorable mention at offensive tackle.

"John has worked really hard in

the weight room preparing for the season," said McLean. "He has been a solid lineman for us the past two seasons."

Goodland kicker Ren Scherling was one of just three sophomores who made the all-league first-team this year. He kicked 15 extra points and a field goal, averaged over 46 yards per kickoff.

"Ren did a good job kicking extra points for us," McLean said. "He improved his kickoffs as the year went on."

Coach McLean said he wanted to recognize two other seniors, Brandon Tatman and John Beeson. Both suffered injuries but still managed to contribute to the team's efforts.

Tatman ended the season with 44 tackles and recovered two fumbles, one of which he ran back for a touchdown. He also blocked a punt. Beeson had 17 tackles and a fumble recovery.

McLean said he was glad both of them got to come back and play in the Cowboys' final game against Colby and end their high school football careers on a high note.

Northwest Kansas teams continue to win

All three Northwest Kansas League football teams won their second-round games of the Class 2-1A state playoffs Saturday.

The Indians of St. Francis dominated St. John-Hudson 48-0 and will face Smith Center in St. Francis at 6 p.m. Mountain Time on Friday. Smith Center, meanwhile, improved to 11-0 for the season after beating Sacred Heart High of Salina 58-14.

Goodland radio KKCI (102.5 FM) will broadcast the game live starting around 5:45.

In playoff action, the St. Francis Indians, now 9-2, have outscored their opponents 90-0.

Oakley and Hoxie also won Sat-

urday and will face each other in Oakley on Friday. The Plainsmen, now 11-0, beat LaCross High 46-0, while the Hoxie Indians, 8-3, defeated Claflin 16-6.

Oakley beat Hoxie during the regular season 8-6.

The winner of the Oakley/Hoxie game will face the St. Francis/Smith Center winner on Friday, Nov. 18.

In Division I 8-man football, the Rebels of South Gray High in Montezuma outscored Weskan 8-6 in the fourth quarter to win the game

28-26 and end the Coyotes' bid for a state championship. Weskan finished the season 7-4.

In Class 4A, Concordia fell to Andale 39-14 while Ulysses advanced to the next round after a 45-10 win over Pratt.
