The group charges a \$50 letter of intent fee (similar to a permit) which is good for one year. It is required on the installation or modification of all septic systems in the protection group's area.

The group will continue to offer free testing to private individuals. However, if you are selling, purchasing or refinancing any property that requires an inspection, the group will charge a \$90 inspection fee. The inspection includes site evaluations on well and septic systems and testing the water. The group will also charge a \$25 fee for child care and foster care inspections.

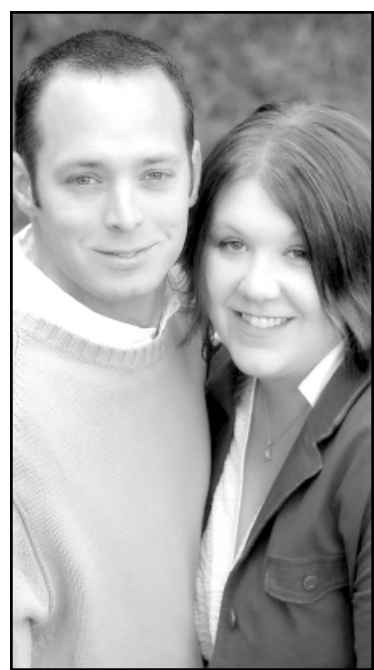
November wedding planned

Seaman sisters sold millinery store

November 16, 1905: Millinery Store Sold — The Seaman Sisters store was sold last week to Mrs. D.J. Bryan and Mrs. J.W. Allen, who will take possession of the store and goods about the middle of January. Mrs. Allen is an employee in the dress goods department of the Millisack store, and Mrs. Bryan is the owner of considerable town property and a resident for several years of Smoky township before her husband died. Since his demise, Mrs. Bryan and the other members of her family have been living in Goodland.

November 17, 1905: Bloody Row At Resort — Grace Sterling Uses Gun On F.L. Coffin — As a result of a drunken fight at Grace Sterling's resort Wednesday night, in which several parties took a hand, Frank L. Coffin, commonly called 'Pete,' is lying at the Coffin place, in the south part of town, in a serious condition.

He is suffering from a bullet wound in one side, inflicted by Grace Sterling, and from a severe kick in the other side, administered by one of the men engaged in the mele.

Frank Coffin says the trouble started about 10 o'clock in the evening, but it would seem from other evidences that it was at a much later hour. At about midnight or later, Grace Sterling, the keeper of the resort, ran to the office of Dr. Carmichael summoning him to come to her place to give medical aid to the injured.

She was in negligee attire and very much excited and ran back as fast as she came. Dr. Carmichael hurried to the scene of the trouble,

but when he got there, Pete Coffin, the injured man, had gone.

Later, it developed that he was in such a dazed condition that he wandered confusedly around on the prairie in the wet chilly weather for several hours, at last reaching the Mack Robinson's place. Someone then telephoned Dr. Gulick a hurry up call, and he dressed the wounds of Coffin. After that he was taken to the Coffin place in the south part of town.

Dr. Gulick said to a reporter that he was as yet unable to locate the position of the bullet in Coffin's body. He said the bullet took effect when Coffin was apparently prostrated on the floor, starting in its course in the right side below the hip and ranging upward into the body. At present, the doctor said, Coffin is suffering most from the severe kick in his left side, and from the shock of the wound.

Some time after the fight, Sheriff Bradley was notified, and he went to the resort and arrested all the occupants, Grace Sterling, and two others, inmates, Fred Prewitt and Andrew Frydendall, and put them in jail.

At this writing, they are confined in the county prison, and an investigation before court will be held either today or tomorrow. The cause of the trouble is not yet known, but it is thought that booze was the beginning of the disgraceful affair.
