Cookbook throws in twist of wit, dose of faith

If you're looking for a book with a twist of wit, a large dose of faith and recipes, "Supper Smoke" by Ruby Seaman fits the bill.

Seaman tells the story of her homesteading parents' faith and courage in North Dakota. She talks of the hardships of the "dirty thirties" and the never-ending patience of her God and of his love. She has included her poetry.

The following recipes are from her book.

Clam chowder

5 medium potatoes cut up small 2 stalks celery, including some chopped leaves

- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 carrot, grated
- salt and pepper 4 potatoes, grated
- 2 or 3 cans minced or chopped
- clams, undrained
- 1/4 teaspoon thyme
- cream or top milk

2 or 3 slices cooked, crumbled bacon
