Broncbusters' season extended

The football season for a pair of former Goodland Cowboys was extended last week when the Broncbusters of Garden City Community College were picked to play in the 20th annual Dixie Rotary Bowl on Dec. 3 in St. George, Utah.

Freshmen Derrick Raymer and David Livengood, both 2005 graduates of Goodland High, will suit up with their teammates to take on the Rebels of Dixie State College of Utah.

Garden City and Dixie State are tied at No. 17 in this week's poll by the National Junior College Athletic Association. The Broncbusters are 7-3 and the Rebels 8-3.

As Garden City's punter, Raymer averaged nearly 38 yard per kick, with his longest going for 58 yards. Nine of his punts ended up as touchbacks, with one blocked.

As a backup tailback, Livengood rushed 10 times for 29 yards, with his longest run going for 10 yards. Both players recorded a tackle on

Three other teams from the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference also will be playing in bowl games on Dec. 3.

The Red Ravens of Coffeyville, who won the conference championship with a 33-12 win over Dodge

City Community College on Nov. 6, will face Georgia Military College in the Sea Island Bowl in Brunswick, Ga. The Ravens are ranked No. 4 in the nation with a 9-2 record, while Georgia Military, 8-2, is No. 8.

Dodge City will head south to Texas to take on Cisco Junior College (Texas) in the Heart of Texas Bowl in Copperas. The Conquistadors are 7-4 and ranked No. 19. Cisco is 6-4.

The Grizzlies of Butler County Community College, ranked No. 6, will play No. 13 against Snow College (Utah) in the Top of the Mountains Bowl in Salt Lake City. Butler County is 9-1 for the season.

Bluejays start playoffs Saturday in Wichita

The Bluejays of Tabor College defeated the University of St. Mary 43-8 last Saturday to finish their regular season 10-0.

The Bluejays, who qualified for the national playoffs for the third straight year, will face the Yellow-jackets of Graceland University (Iowa) in the first round at 1:30 p.m. (Central Time) on Saturday in Wichita's Cessna Stadium.

Tabor enters the game ranked No. 6 by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics in its final regular season poll. Graceland, at 9-2, is No. 12.

The Coyotes of Kansas Wesleyan University defeated Bethany College last weekend 28-25 finishing their season 8-2. The Coyotes are ranked No. 21 in the latest poll but did not make the playoffs. Bethany ended up 2-8.

Colby native Brent Deibert, a junior defensive end at Kansas Wesleyan, saw action in eight games for the Coyotes making 17 tackles including a quarterback sack.

In other games around the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference on Saturday, Friends University (7-

3) defeated Sterling College (5-4) 40-19; Bethel College (3-7) beat Ottawa University (5-5) 26-6; and Southwestern College (3-7) defeated McPherson College (5-5) 49-21.

MidAmerica Nazarene University of Olathe, a member of the Heart of America Athletic Conference, fell to Graceland 37-16 last Saturday. The loss dropped the Pioneers to 7-3 for the season, costing them a spot in the playoffs. Mid-America Nazarene fell 10 spots to No. 19 in the poll.

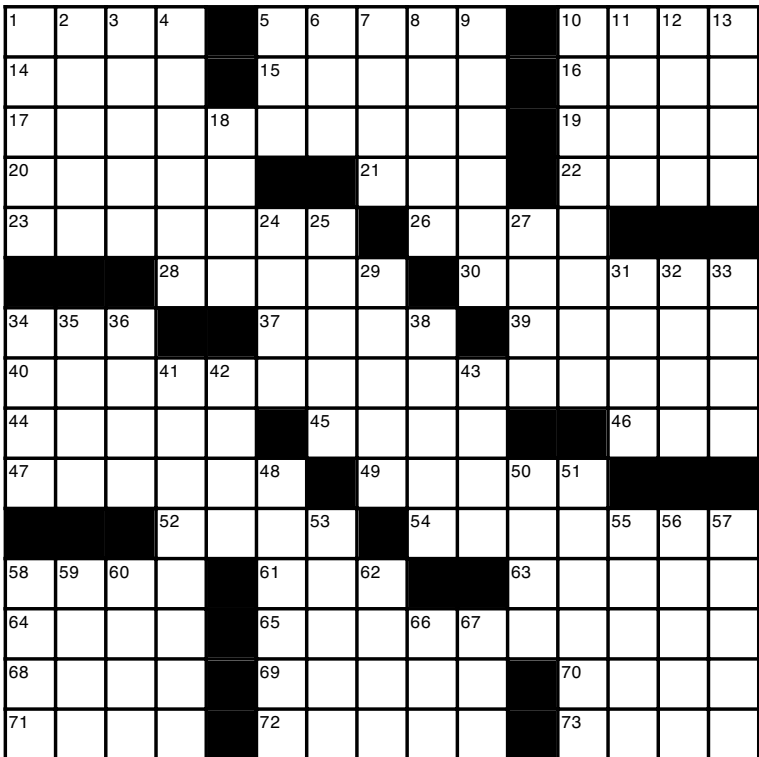
