# Scholars tie for third at Cowboy Classic

The Goodland High School scholars bowl team went 5-3 at the Goodland Cowboy Classic on Monday, finishing in a tie for third. Goodland defeated Rawlins County High of Atwood 80-35; Decatur Community High of Oberlin 50-40; Oakley 80-20; Wallace County of Sharon Springs 80-55; and Colby 40-30. The team lost to Greeley County of Tribune 50-40; Cheylin High of Bird City 60-40; and to Quinter 90-50.

The Quinter Bulldogs won the meet, with Colby finishing second. Both teams went 6-2 but Quinter beat Colby in head-to-head competition.

Competing for Goodland were juniors Lea Shores and Michael Smith; sophomore Brett Meissinger; and freshmen T.J. Freeman and Brad Geist.

"A special thanks from the team goes to the community volunteers who helped read, score, judge and time," said Coach Jo Ann Wahrman. "It was also great to see the audience support for the team."

"We have the honor to host the league meet on Jan. 9, and would like to see as many supporters as we can."

# Lady Trojans win two, now 4-1

The Colby Community College women's basketball team won both of its games last weekend at the Northeastern Junior College Roundball Classic in Sterling, Colo., improving to 4-1 for the season.

Last Friday, the Lady Trojans beat Colorado Northwestern Community College 109-43 after leading 43-13 at halftime. Sophomore Rita Kollo and freshman Jamie Schroeder both scored 29 points to lead Colby against the Lady Spartans. Sophomore Ivana Mijalcevic scored 15 points and led the team in rebounds with 10.

Colby had a tougher time the next day against the host Plainswomen of Northeastern, building up just a five-point lead at halftime 36-31.

However, Colby's defense got a bit more stubborn in the second half and the Trojans outscored their opponents 35-26 to win the game 71-57.

Kollo scored 25 points and grabbed six rebounds to lead Colby in both categories. Schroeder and sophomore Suzana Sormaz each added 10 points.

Colby native Ivy Ramsey, in her second season with the Trojans, scored four points in both games, bringing her total to 18 for the season. She also has 10 rebounds and eight steals.

The Lady Trojans play their home opener starting around 5 p.m. (Mountain Time) tonight at the Colby Community Building against Independence Community College.

# Trojan volleyball finishes 28-13

The Colby Community College volleyball women ended their season with a 3-1 loss to Barton County Community College last Sunday at the regional tournament in Hutchinson.

The Lady Trojans entered the double-elimination tournament with a 28-13 record. In their first match Saturday, the Trojans faced top-seeded Hutchinson Community College, falling to the Blue Dragons 30-23, 30-15 and 30-24.

Colby had a tough time in its second match against Seward County Community College but prevailed 30-18, 26-30, 30-22, 34-36 and 15-13. The win set up the Trojans' match the next day against Barton County, which the Lady Cougars won 30-23, 20-30, 30-25 and 30-17.

The Cougars then faced Hutchinson in the championship match, with the Dragons beating Barton County 30-25, 30-27 and 30-21.

Hutchinson advances to the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I tournament Monday in West Plains, Mo.

This is the second straight trip to the national tournament for the Lady Dragons, who finished fifth last season in their first-ever appearance.

Colby ended its season 29-15 overall and 5-3 in the West Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference, a big improvement over 12-25 last season.

Sophomore Alicia Ostmeier, a 2004 graduate of Grinnell High, was a second-team all-conference pick this season along with freshman Ana Kokanovic. Sophomore Michele Burkart, Colby's libero, and freshman Cynthia Danthon earned honorable mention.

The Grant Junior High eighth-grade boys basketball had a tough time finding the basket during the first half of its game against Colby Middle School Tuesday at Max Jones Fieldhouse as the Mustangs fell to the Eagles 50-18.

Colby jumped out to a 10-0 lead before Ben Waugh got the Mustangs on the scoreboard with a basket. However, the Eagles continued to dominate and led 23-5 at the end of the first period.

Colby then shutout Grant in the second period 17-0 taking a 40-5 halftime lead into the locker room.

Both teams scored six points in the third period with the Mustangs getting a 7-4 edge in the fourth to make the final 50-18.

Landon Brenner scored six points to lead Grant followed by Colton Nelson with three. Erik Roeder, Kuter Issac and Waugh each scored two with Kevin Amthor, Kyle Stefan and Teather Dautel each scoring on a free throw.

The Eagles also won the B-team game, played earlier, 42-27.

The seventh-grade Mustangs traveled to Colby Tuesday with the A-team winning 33-31 and the B-

team winning 22-20. There also was a C-team game which Colby won 12-2.

Last Thursday in Atwood, the eighth-graders lost to Rawlins County 34-33 and the seventh-graders won 34-24. The two schools played a combined B-team game with each grade playing one quarter in both halves. Atwood won the game 22-8.

The next action for both the seventh and eighth-graders starts at 3:30 p.m. (Mountain Time) Monday in Oakley.

# Washburn chases national titles

It's not often a college ends up a serious contender for a national title in two sports in the same year, and even more unusual when it's during the same season, but that is what's happening at Washburn University.

The Ichabods' football team is 9-2 and earned a first-round bye in the NCAA Division II playoffs. In the second round Saturday, Washburn takes on Northwest Missouri State University at Yager Stadium in Topeka.

Both schools belong to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association. The Ichabods defeated the Bearcats once this season, 31-28, on Oct. 8 in Maryville, Mo.

Washburn broke a 28-all tie with a 23-yard field goal with four seconds left.

The Bearcats, now 8-3, advanced to the second round after beating Angelo State University (Texas) 45-14 last Saturday.

In their last outing on Nov. 5, the Ichabods lost to Missouri Western State University in overtime 28-21 in the final game of the regular season.

The winner Saturday will advance to the quarterfinals on Nov. 26 to face either Pittsburg State University, also a member of the Mid-America Association, or West Texas A&M University from the Lone Star Conference.

Washburn's volleyball team, the Lady Blues, qualified for the regional tournament in Florence, Ala., which started Thursday. The women are 34-2 after losing to Truman State University of Missouri 3-1 last Saturday in the championship match of the post-season conference tournament.

Washburn's only other loss also was to Truman State 3-2 on Sept. 17 in Kirksville. The Lady Blues beat Truman State 3-1 on Oct. 15 in Topeka.

Washburn was to have faced Harding University (Ark.) Thursday. If victorious, the Lady Blues will take on either Truman State or the University of Alabama in Huntsville today.
