• If considering a gift card or gift certificate, you should buy only from reputable, financially sound merchants. If the merchant should go out of business, the gift card will be worthless.

• Keep delivery time in mind. When buying gifts via the Internet or catalog, consider whether you can buy that item locally. Purchasing locally can often reduce problems with returns and refunds. Also consider whether the Internet or catalog merchant can ship the merchandise in time for the holidays. The Internet and discount catalogs can often be a source of great bar-

• Read the fine print on rebates. Rebates sound great and can often save you money, but only if you shopping you come across a deal mail them in on time. You should immediately complete the rebate form and mail in all of the required materials. For larger rebate amounts, it may be wise to mail the materials via certified mail, return receipt requested. Remember, these rebate claims often take six to eight weeks to process, sometimes more.
