Cyclones spoil Cowboy plans

By Greg Stover The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys' chance to repeat as the Topside Tip-Off champions was spoiled Saturday night as they got beat by Ottawa Cyclones 72-52 in the tournament finals.

Ottawa scored the game's first four points and never trailed, as the closest Goodland got was two points. By the end of the first period, the Cyclones led 27-16, increasing their advantage to 42-27 at halftime.

Ottawa used a 10-point run in the middle of the third period to build up a 22-point at 56-34, after which the Cyclones responded to nearly every score Goodland made and hung on for a 72-52 win.

This was Ottawa's third tournament championship in five straight appearances in the Topside Tip-Off. The Cyclones also won in 2002 and 2003, and finished third last year.

Seniors Jace Herl and Derek Fenner led the Cowboys with 14 and 11 points, respectively, followed by senior Wyatt Dautel with nine. Juniors Landon Williams and Nick Angelos both scored eight, and junior Mikey Doll two.

Herl led the team in rebounds with 12 followed by Angelos with seven

Goodland opened the tournament on Thursday with a 72-52 win over Wray High School of Colorado. Herl started the scoring with a basket and a free throw for a 3-0 Cowboy lead. After the Eagles scored their first two points, Goodland went on a 13-point run to make it 15-2 and led 22-12 going into the second period.

After the teams exchanged baskets, the Cowboys took off on a 12point run to make the score 36-14. Later, Doll stole the ball and scored on a layup with three seconds left in the half to give Goodland a 44-18 lead during the break.

A three-pointer by Herl early in the third period gave the Cowboys a 31-point lead at 52-21. Three straight three-point baskets by Wray's Branson Real appeared to cut Goodland's lead down a bunch, but the Cowboy's responded with their second 13-point run of the game to make it 65-30.

Trailing 65-32 at the start of the final period, the Eagles outscored Goodland 20-7, but it was not enough as the Cowboys won 72-52.

Four Goodland players scored in double-digits, led by Angelos with 17. Herl scored 16, Doll 13 and
