The program gives businesses and homeowners incentive to improve their property, Timm said, and could help create jobs and reverse the exodus of people from the area. County Commissioner Kevin

Rasure said he is pleased the program was put into effect this year. Rasure said the plan requires a property owner to make a minimum \$5,000 investment in improving a

property. The work has to comply with all building codes, and in the city, the owner needs to have a building permit.
