'Your response does not obligate your participation at this time, but merely indicates whether or not we should pursue the secretary of transportation's final approval of this project," Desch wrote. "Secretary (Deb) Miller is considering announcing the approved projects in late January."

The county's share of the project will depend on approval of a special 1 percent sales tax the city and county have been discussing since May. Plans are to introduce a bill in the state Legislature to give the county permission to ask the citizens to approve tax for road projects.

Commissioner Kevin Rasure said he had talked with Rep. Jim Morrison and Sen. Ralph Ostmeyer to have them carry the bill. Under state law, the county has to have permission to increase its sales tax beyond the current 1.25 percent.




