Dear Attorney General Kline: My husband and I have been thinking about starting our own small business and have been considering a variety of funding options.

I have recently received both phone calls and e-mail messages from a group claiming to represent the federal government and offering to help me get a grant for our business.

I've been asked to send a required processing fee to secure this substantial grant, but I'm leery about doing this. Am I right to be concerned?

Dear Kansas Consumer:

You should definitely be concerned and skeptical about this offer. Once again, it appears that con artists claiming to assist the federal government in distributing grant
