Goodland had to come from behind back to tie the game at 52 in the final minute of regulation play. Later, Colby had to score a basket with seven seconds left in overtime to tie it at 60 and force a second extra period.

'I'm still not sure how we won the game," said Coach Jon McLean. "We played pretty poorly, and I was really disappointed in our defense, but I'll give our kids credit for finding a way to win. They never quit."

Colby's Trey Barnett scored the game's first three points, but Goodland senior Jase Herl scored the next four. After that, Goodland kept the lead until late in the second period.

With less than two minutes left in the first half, though, the Eagles' Trevor Siebert scored a basket to give Colby a 27-26 lead. Siebert's basket started an eight-point run which gave the Eagles a 33-26 halftime advantage.

Goodland coach Don Smith called a timeout with the clock showing seven seconds. After that, Goodland brought the ball down the court with Billinger making a drive to the basket but her short jumper bounced back off the rim as time ran out.
