

Ex-Cowboy wrestler sees Iowa mat action

Former Cowboy wrestler Bryce Bahe, now a sophomore at Fort Hays State University, saw his first mat action of the season last Saturday at the Cliff Keen National Duals in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

In their first dual, Fort Hays faced the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Bahe, wrestling at 141 pounds, lost a 3-2 decision to the Mavericks' Chris Alt as Nebraska-Omaha defeated the Tigers 24-9.

Going into the tournament, Fort Hays State was ranked No. 10 by the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches Association, but Nebraska-Omaha was No. 1.

The Mavericks went on to win the team competition.



Bahe

The Tigers' second dual was against No. 16 Gannon University of Pennsylvania. Bahe won an 11-3 major decision over Gannon's Brian Yoder, helping Fort Hays State earn a 25-12 win.

In their final dual, the Tigers faced No. 7 Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania. Bahe lost a 5-2 decision to the Red Raiders' Alex Renn. The team score ended up tied at 16, with both teams winning five matches, but Shippensburg got to advance further based on individual points earned.

Bryce, the son of Randy and Kathy Bahe of Goodland, is a 2003 graduate of Goodland High. He

wrestled for Minnesota State University, Mankato during the 2003-2004 season.

His younger brother Blayze, in his second year at the University of Northern Colorado, is redshirting this season.

Norton native James Annon, a redshirt freshman for the Tigers at 133 pounds, went 0-2 at the National Duals. He is now 12-9 for the season.

The Tigers, now 3-1-1 in duals, will hit the mat again on Sunday at Chadron State College (Neb.) for their first conference match of the season. The next home action for the team is on Friday, Jan. 27, when the Colorado School of Mines visits Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays.

Five wrestlers place at junior varsity tourney

Five Goodland High School wrestlers placed among the top three in their weight classes at the Prairie Junior Varsity Classic last Saturday in Hays, leading the Cowboys to third place in the tournament.

Freshman Fernando Martinez won the gold medal at 171 pounds. Junior Kerek Mason, wrestling at 125 pounds, and freshman Ryan Taylor, at 152 pounds, both placed second, earning silver medals.

Freshmen Kade Sheldon and Bryan Gray placed third at 103 and 119 pounds, respectively.

Other Goodland wrestlers in Hays Saturday were junior Brandon Douglas, at 140 pounds; sophomore Toby Hurst, 145; freshman T.J. Freeman, 125; freshman Brad Geist, 130; freshman Vance Johnson, 160; and freshman heavy-weight Clay Schilling.

Garden City High won the team competition with 231 points, with Colby second at 227. Goodland scored 108.

Seven Cowboys wrestled at a junior varsity tournament in Lakin last Tuesday, with three of them winning three matches. Senior

Brandon Hatfield went 3-0 at 160 pounds. Mason, at 125 pounds, and Gray, at 119, both went 3-1.

Others wrestling in Lakin were Martinez, who went 2-2 at 171 pounds; Sheldon, 1-3 at 103; Freeman, 0-4 at 125; and Geist, 0-4 at 130.

The next junior varsity action will be Friday, Jan. 27, when the Red Devils from Decatur Community High in Oberlin visit Max Jones Fieldhouse for a dual meet against the Cowboys.

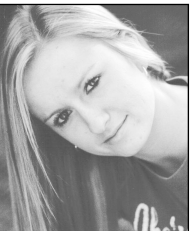
