

# Girls, boys face Wichita

The 21st Annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic tipped off Thursday with both Goodland High basketball teams facing Wichita South High School.

In other girls' games Thursday, Colby faced Scott City; Beloit took on Ulysses; and Liberal played McCook.

For the boys it was Colby against Beloit, Scott City against McCook and Liberal against Olathe North High. Thursday's results were not available at press time.

The Cowgirls continue play around 3 p.m. (Mountain Time) today against either Liberal or McCook at either the Colby Community Building or Colby High School depending on Thursday's results.

The Cowgirls were 8-2 heading into the tournament. Senior Justeen

Koehler was the team's leading scorer averaging more than 14 points per game. Juniors Whitney Archer, Emily Murray and Kaylee Billinger are averaging seven or more points each.

"The Orange and Black will present one challenge after another," said Cowgirls coach Don Smith. "Weaknesses that we show in one game will exploited in other games."

The Cowboys will play around 5:30 p.m. today against either Scott City or McCook at one of the two venues again depending on Thursday's results.

The team has three players averaging in the double figures led by senior Jase Herl who is scoring 15 points per game. Senior Wyatt Dautel is averaging 13 and junior Nick Angelos 11.

# Six league teams go to Oberlin

All eight boys basketball teams of the Northwest Kansas League take the court today in tournament action, six in the Oberlin Invitational and the other two in the 21st annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic in Colby.

The Plainsmen of Oakley High sit on top of the boys' standings with a 4-0 league record. Oakley is now 9-1 overall after beating Rawlins County High of Atwood Tuesday 67-52 in the first round of the Oberlin tourney. The Plainsmen will face the Hoxie Indians on today.

In other first-round games Tuesday, Hoxie defeated St. Francis 48-4 and Cambridge High of Nebraska beat Decatur Community High of Oberlin 67-39. Quinter faced Resurrection Christian High of Colorado Thursday but results were not available at press time.

The Oberlin Invitational continues today and finishes up Saturday.

The Goodland Cowboys are 8-2 overall and 2-0 in the league. They were to play Wichita South High on Thursday at the Colby Community

Building in the opening round of the Orange and Black. The tournament continues today and concludes Saturday.

The Colby Eagles, who won their first game of the season last Friday, were to face Beloit High School on Thursday in their first game of the Classic. The Eagles are 1-9 overall and 1-2 in league play.

In other boys games Thursday in Colby, Scott City was to face McCook and Olathe North High was set to play Liberal.

Three teams have 2-2 league records. The Bulldogs of Quinter are 7-2 overall while both St. Francis and Hoxie are 7-4. The Red Devils of Decatur Community are 1-3 in league play and 2-9 overall. Atwood is 0-3 in the league and 4-6 overall.

Quinter is ranked No. 3 in Class 2A by the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association.

In league games last Friday, Goodland beat Atwood 66-46; Colby defeated Hoxie 46-28; Oakley beat St. Francis 66-50; and Quinter dominated Oberlin 76-34.

# Goodland graduate scores nine points

Goodland native Jayci Stone, a junior guard at New Mexico State University, scored a season-high nine points, all on three-pointers, in the Lady Aggies' 68-52 road loss to California State University, Fresno on Jan. 12.

Two days later, New Mexico State won its fifth game of the season, defeating the University of Hawaii in double overtime 72-69 in Honolulu. The Aggies are now 5-10 overall and 1-2 in the Western Athletic Conference. Hawaii is 10-4 and 1-1 in conference play.

Stone, in her first season at New Mexico State, has played in 10 of 15 games, starting one. She has 23

points and nine rebounds. She played her freshman and sophomore seasons at Colby Community College.

Jayci, a 2003 graduate of Goodland High, is the daughter of Dennis and Karen Stone of Goodland. She made the All-Northwest Kansas League basketball team her junior and senior years as a Cowgirl.

The Lady Aggies have three straight home games to look forward to starting with Louisiana Tech University on Saturday.

Fresno State, 11-4 overall, sits on top of the conference standings with a 3-0 record.
