Boys have best finish in 15 years at tourney

The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys basketball team produced its best finish in 15 years at the annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic over the weekend, placing fourth with a 44-42 win over Liberal on Saturday at Colby High School.

but since then the team's best showing was fifth last year.

Saturday's game started out as a defensive struggle, as neither team scored in the first minute. Liberal got on the scoreboard first with a three-pointer and led throughout the period, taking a 9-6 lead into the second.

Defense continued to be theme, as both teams managed just four points halfway through the second quarter, making it 13-10. Goodland senior Jase Herl scored his second basket of the game to make it 13-12, then a short time later made another one to give Goodland its first lead 14-13 with three minutes left in the half.

About two minutes later, the Redskins scored a basket to go back on top 15-14. With 32 seconds left to go, a free throw by senior Derek Fenner tied the game at 15, then eight seconds later one by junior Landon Williams put Goodland ahead 16-15, which is how the teams went into the locker room at the break.

The third period started like the first, with neither team scoring in the first minute. Liberal's Zach Miller hit a three-pointer, putting the Redskins ahead 18-16, then a pair of free throws increased their lead to 20-16.

A basket by sophomore Tanner Smith got the Cowboys within two, then about a minute later, Williams scored to tie the game at 20. Liberal responded by scoring the next six points, and with around 70 seconds left in the period led 26-20.

Senior Wyatt Dautel scored a basket to make it 26-22, then following a basket by the Redskins, hit a threepointer with 15 seconds on the clock to make the score 28-25 going into the final quarter.

Goodland junior Nick Angelos started the scoring in the fourth with a basket to get the Cowboys within one. 


Swimmer has busy season
