# Heart association offers health tips to help avoid No. 1 killer

We've been hearing for quite some time now that heart disease is the no. 1 killer of both women and men. In Kansas it is the cause of 33.4 percent of all deaths. It can strike even if you are

young, active and otherwise healthy. Statistics show that no disease, not even cancer, claims the number of women's lives as does cardiovascular disease. It is the cause of approximately one death per minute among females — that's nearly half a million female lives every year nationally.

Although you can't change some of your risk factors for heart disease such as age, race and heredity – there are some things you can do to help ensure a healthier heart. The American Heart Association suggests the following:

1. Let each birthday remind you that it's time for your yearly checkup. At that time, discuss with your doctor how you can reduce your risk for heart disease.

2. Exercise for at least 30 minutes most days of the week.

3. Quit smoking. Begin by cutting the number of cigarettes each day until you are down to zero.

4. If you are overweight, cutting just 200-300 calories a day can help you lose up to two pounds per week and bring you closer to a hearthealthy weight.

5. Check out the Nutrition Facts panel on packaged foods to see how much salt they contain. Aim for a total daily intake of no more than 2,300 milligrams (about a teaspoon) per day.
