The Cowboys had three wrestlers advance to the tournament finals with junior Brett Bahe winning at 119 pounds with a 13-1 major decision over Gage Reichert of Decatur Community High in


The wrestlers started the final period in the neutral position. Neither scored for the first 90 seconds, however Luedke scored a takedown and went on to win a 5-4 decision.
