Indians knock off the Cowboys

The Cowboys basketball team suffered its first league loss of the season Friday in St. Francis, losing to the Indians 66-60.

Goodland fell behind 17-11 in the first period but began to rally in the second, outscoring the home team 17-14 to trail by three at halftime 31-28.

The Cowboys dominated the third period 20-12 and led 48-43 going into the fourth. However, the Indians owned the final quarter, outscoring Goodland 23-12 to win 66-60.

The Cowboys are now 3-1 in the Northwest Kansas League while St. Francis improved to 3-2. Both

teams are 11-5 overall.

Senior Jase Herl led Goodland with 20 points. Senior Heath Chatfield had a season-high 11 points and junior Mikey Doll scored 10. Senior Derek Fenner and junior Landon Williams both scored six, and senior Wyatt Dautel added five points. Junior Nick Angelos had

two points. Joel McAtee scored a game-high 24 points to lead St. Francis. Levi Weeden scored 16.

In other league games Friday, Oakley defeated Rawlins County High of Atwood 57-52 and Colby beat Decatur Community High of Oberlin 58-45. Hoxie and Quinter had Friday off.

Goodland grad's team still winning

Coach Nyla Milleson and the Lady Panthers of Drury University in Springfield, Mo., continued their drive to the NCAA Division II national championship with a 90-71 win Saturday over Lewis University of Illinois.

Milleson, a 1980 graduate of Goodland High, is now in her sixth year guiding the Lady Panthers after leading them to a 20-6 record and the Heartland Conference championship in 2000-2001, the team's inaugural season. The Panthers

have enjoyed winning records since and were the national runners-up for the 2003-2004 season.

With their latest win, the Panthers improve to 18-1 overall and 13-0 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. Drury will take on Rockhurst University (Mo.) today in a conference matchup.

Drury's only loss for the season was to the Lady Blues of Washburn University on Dec. 17.

Washburn is ranked No. 1 by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The Lady Blues, 22-0, are one of just three undefeated teams left in Division II women's basketball.

container, which would be picked up once a week.

"We really don't know how much paper the high school generates on a weekly basis," she said, "but we could start with the smaller container."

The two-cubic-yard container costs \$790, and a larger four-cubic-yard model costs \$1,100.

"We don't quite have the money to buy these," she said.

"We have about \$200 to buy the wastebaskets for the classrooms to collect the paper."

City Commissioner Dave Daniels, who is the county representative on the East Central Recycling board, said the city has paid

for the containers around town, and the county pays the \$2-per-head annual membership fee.

Mayor Rick Billinger said it was a good plan, and the city ought to buy the container.

"We'll take care of the outside," Billinger said.

"The kids will buy the baskets for the inside."

City Commissioner Annette Fairbanks agreed it was a good plan, and commended the students.

She made a motion to purchase the container, and it was approved unanimously.

Reitcheck said she would have to get the project approved by the school administration, but they hope to place the container on the west edge of the football field.

Six wrestlers win in Colby

Six members of the Goodland Wrestling Club earned gold medals at the Kansas Kids wrestling tournament in Colby on Saturday, Jan. 28.

Simon Bassett won at 49 pounds in the 6-year-old and under competition. In the 8-and-under category, Aaron Avelar won at 52 pounds and James Dinkel won at 67 pounds.

For 10-and-under, Brooke Bahe won at 95 pounds, as did Taylen Smith at 150. Laine Herl earned the gold at 130 pounds for 12-and-under.

In the 6-and-under competition, Tristan Weber placed second at 46 pounds with Dawson Ensign finishing third at 52. Placing fourth were Levi Archer at 58 pounds and heavyweight Caleb Rains. Jordan Raby was fifth at 46 pounds.

Other Goodland wrestlers competing at 6-and-under were Isaac Walton and Tate Withington, both at 46 pounds, Evin Bergquist at 58 pounds.

Coy Johnson placed second at 64 pounds in the 8-and-under competition, as did Kolt Trachsel at 76 pounds. Third-place finishers were

Josh David at 58 pounds and heavy-weight Drew House. Kelby Smith was fourth at 61 pounds and John Salinas and Gerrill Miller were fifth at 58 and 67 pounds respectively.

Other wrestling at 8-and-under were Brock Butts, at 58 pounds; Tanner Gastineau, Alec Gonzales and Tristan Cooper, all at 61 pounds; Jacob Strasser at 64 pounds; and Luke Avila at 67.

Finishing second at 10-and-under were George Sun, at 67 pounds; Jed Gray and Colton Cooper, both at 76 but in separate brackets; and Ian Bonsall at 110. Garrett Taylor was third at 95 pounds, as was Cody Hooker at 110.

Fourth at 10-and-under were John Peden at 85 pounds and Shay Miller at 90. Austin Rains was fifth at 85 pounds and Austin Ray was fifth at 100. Tyler Gastineau wrestled at 95 pounds.

Goodland wrestlers placing second in 12-and under were Austin Avelar, at 72 pounds; Garnett Geist, at 105; and Jason Cowan, 115. Derek Mathews was third at 88 pounds and Mikail Freeman competed at 105.
