# **Broncs unsaddle Cowboys**

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys were unsaddled Tuesday by the visiting Broncs of Lakin High, 78-65, in a nonleague contest at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The visitors scored first and led throughout the first period. After that, though, Goodland came back to take the lead by halftime. Fans saw six lead changes and the game tied three times before the Broncs pulled away in the final minutes to win by 13.

The loss was the second straight for the Cowboys, now 11-6 for the season.

Lakin took the lead early when Roman Lane hit a three-pointer about 25 seconds after the tipoff. The Broncs took a 17-11 advantage into the second quarter.

A six-point run halfway through the period resulted in a 10-point lead for the Broncs at 27-17. However, the Cowboys grabbed the
