The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowgirls made their final home game of the regular season memorable with a 62-44 win Friday over the Lady Plainsmen of Oakley at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

"I thought our game with Oakley was out most complete game of the year," said Coach Don Smith. "At times, we caused a great deal of confusion with our changing defenses. We were trying to keep the ball away from the basket, because with Oakley's size, they were difficult to defend close to the basket."

The Cowgirls dominated the first period, taking an 18-4 lead into the second. There Goodland edged the visitors 14-13 to take a 15-point lead into the locker room, 32-17.

The Cowgirls outscored the Lady Plainsmen 19-13 in the third quarter to make the score 51-30. Oakley got the scoring advantage in the fourth 14-11, making the final 62-44.

Senior Justeen Koehler sank a career-high 33 points to lead the Cowgirls to their fourth straight win. The girls remain perfect in the Northwest Kansas League at 5-0.
