family shelter

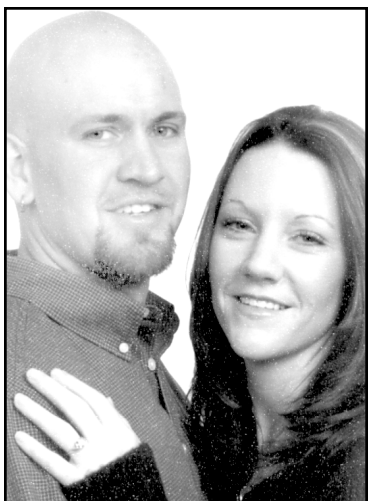
