'Rapid refund' can be costly loan

Dear Attorney General Kline:

It looks like I may be getting a sizable Federal income tax refund this year. I have some bills due soon, so I've been thinking about getting a



The first thing to remember is that you would be applying for a short-term loan that could turn out to be expensive. "Rapid refunds" or Refund Anticipation Loans are available through many tax preparation agencies as a means for taxpayers to receive loans equal to the anticipated refund more than a week sooner than if one were to file through the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

These loans are secured by the presumed amount of the refund, which of course means you will pay bank and processing fees up front and face the possibility of high interest charges until you receive your refund.

It's a good thing to keep in mind that by securing a loan for a presumed amount, you run the risk of receiving a smaller refund than expected or that the IRS could disallow your refund altogether.

In some cases, consumers lose money as a result of these types of loans because if there is a mistake in preparing a tax return, and there will actually be no refund, the loan must be paid back in full.

If your refund were to be delayed, you could face high interest charges and expensive late fees.

There are more cost-effective and efficient ways to file and receive your refund rather than filing by mail. For example, the IRS now gives taxpayers the option of filing taxes and avoiding a middleman by filing either electronically or using tax software.

In addition, this year taxpayers with an adjusted gross income of \$50,000 or less can file electronically free by going through the IRS web site. Just go to www.irs.gov and click on "Free File" and you'll be able to

select a private company that will file federal tax returns at no charge.

By using this service and designating your refund to be deposited directly into a bank account, many times your refund will be available in about two weeks.

An additional word of caution is necessary: the IRS has received reports of e-mail "phishing" scams from con artists posing as IRS agents. The messages may have slightly different formats but they all promise to send your refund after you provide some personal information.

The bogus e-mails are supposedly from the IRS with links to a web site very similar to the official IRS web site. Some of these fake emails promise to take you to a secure web site and use official language about tax laws.

Don't be fooled: these tricks are all designed to coax you to provide personal information that could lead to the theft of your identity. If you are not sure about any correspondence sent to you by the IRS, you can contact the IRS by calling (800) 829-1040.

If you are a tax procrastinator every year, there is some good news. You'll have two extra days to file since April 15th is on a Saturday, making this year's deadline Monday, April 17th.
