Seventh-grader Seth Miller was the only gold medal winner for Grant pinning Dustin Vap of Atwood 34 seconds into the second period of the championshp match at 80 pounds. Miller, who had a bye in the first round, also won by a second-round fall in the semifinals over his opponent from Oberlin. Miller finished the season 20-1.

Three Mustang wrestlers finished second in their weight classes Tuesday. Earning silver medals were Tim Roeder, at 130 pounds; Eduardo Martinez, at 138; and Colten Nelson, at 162.

Placing third Tuesday were Teather Dautel, at 104 pounds, and Kayler Rietcheck, at 110. Finishing fourth were Dillon Trachsel, at 86 pounds; Chris Bustillos, at 92 pounds; Zac Prine, at 154; and heavyweight Jay Cotter.

Other wrestlers competing for Grant were Erik Roeder, at 116 pounds; Hazen Deeds, at 122; Paul Starr, at 146; David Murray, at 170; and Bryan Guyer, at 182. Goodland was open at 98 pounds.

Colby won the tournament with a final score of 147.5. Oakley was second with 137.5 and Atwood was third with 112.5. The Mustangs' score was 111. Oberlin was fifth with 103 points followed by St. Quinter with 15.
