

Mustang wrestlers end season

The Mustangs of Grant Junior High finished fourth at the North-west Kansas League wrestling tournament Tuesday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Seventh-grader Seth Miller was the only gold medal winner for Grant pinning Dustin Vap of Atwood 34 seconds into the second period of the championship match at 80 pounds. Miller, who had a bye in the first round, also won by a second-round fall in the semifinals over his opponent from Oberlin. Miller finished the season 20-1.

Three Mustang wrestlers finished second in their weight classes Tuesday. Earning silver medals were Tim Roeder, at 130 pounds; Eduardo Martinez, at 138; and Colten Nelson, at 162.

Placing third Tuesday were Teather Dautel, at 104 pounds, and Kayler Rietcheck, at 110. Finishing fourth were Dillon Trachsel, at 86 pounds; Chris Bustillos, at 92 pounds; Zac Prine, at 154; and heavyweight Jay Cotter.

Other wrestlers competing for Grant were Erik Roeder, at 116 pounds; Hazen Deeds, at 122; Paul Starr, at 146; David Murray, at 170; and Bryan Guyer, at 182. Goodland was open at 98 pounds.

Colby won the tournament with a final score of 147.5. Oakley was second with 137.5 and Atwood was third with 112.5. The Mustangs' score was 111. Oberlin was fifth with 103 points followed by St. Francis with 96, Hoxie with 55 and Quinter with 15.

Seventh grade girls dominate Quinter

The seventh-grade Lady Mustang basketball team dominated Quinter on Monday in the first round of the Northwest Kansas League tournament, beating the Lady Bulldogs 34-8 at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

With the win, the Grant Junior High team advanced to the semifinals against Oakley on Thursday in Quinter.

Each league team played two games in Quinter Thursday, completing both the championship and consolation brackets.

In Monday's game in Goodland, the Lady Mustangs held their opponent to just two points in each of the four quarters. Grant led 10-2 after the first period and 16-4 at halftime.

In the third period, the Mus-

tangs scored 13 straight points and kept Quinter scoreless for the first five minutes, then took a 29-6 lead into the final period. The scoring slowed down a bit in the fourth as Grant outscored the visitors 5-2 to make the final 34-8.

Ashley Archer scored 18 points to lead Grant, followed by Jade Herl with 12.

Both Christy Studer and Andrea Roeder added two points for the Mustangs.

Taylor Blackwill led Quinter with four points.

In eighth-grade action, the Lady Mustangs traveled to Oberlin on Monday, losing 38-21. The eighth-grade tournament also continued on Thursday but in Oakley, where Grant was to face Hoxie in the first of its two games there.

Brewster grad scores season-high 20 points

Alicia Collett, a junior forward at Sterling College, scored a season-high 20 points Wednesday to lead the Lady Warriors to a 76-68 overtime win over Southwestern College of Winfield.

The game, played in Sterling, was part of the first round of the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference post-season tournament. The Warriors travel to Hillsboro on Saturday to face Tabor College in the semifinals.

This was Sterling's second win over Southwestern in five days. The Warriors ended their regular season last Saturday with a 70-57 road win over the Lady Moundbuilders. Collett scored 13 points.

Collett, a 2003 graduate of Brewster High, first scored 13 on Feb. 9 during Sterling's 66-62 home

win over Bethel College. A week later, she again scored 13 in the Warriors' 69-58 road loss to Ottawa University.

Collett has 68 points in her last

five games. She also grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds in Ottawa on Feb. 16. Collett has seen action in 27 of 28 games for the Sterling this season, scoring 181 points and get-

ting 83 rebounds.

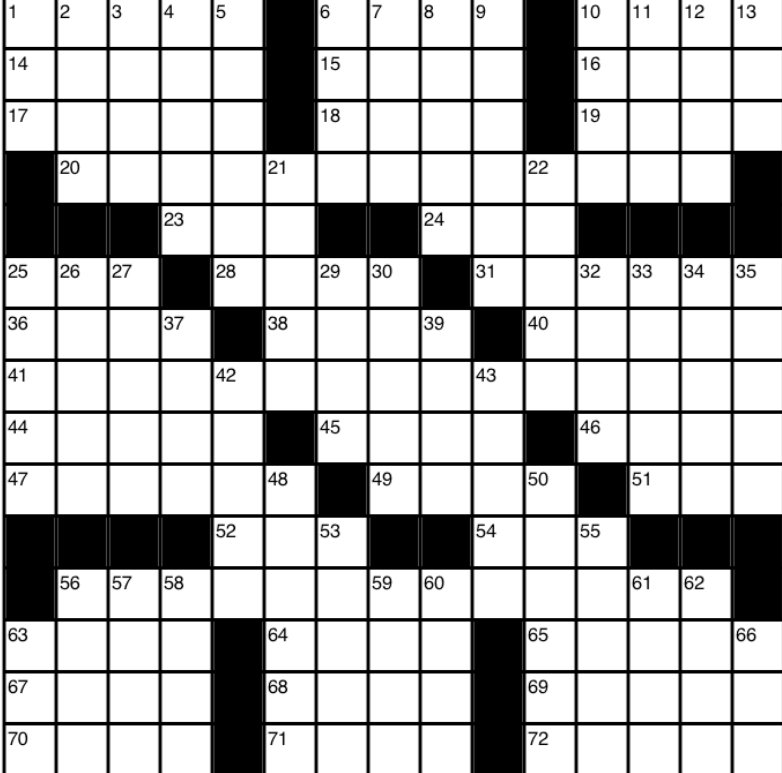
