# Goodland places 10th at state

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland High School wrestling team finished 10th, with two Cowboys finishing among the top six in their weights at the state Class 4A championships over the weekend at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

Junior Brett Bahe is this year's state champion at 119 pounds. Bahe faced Dustin Bowen of Rose Hill in the title match, winning a 9-1 major decision.

Goodland had a rough first round Friday, as the Cowboys won only three of 10 matches.

Bahe won all four of his matches on his way to the title. Sophomores T.J. Hawkins, wrestling at 215 pounds, and heavyweight Bob Doxon, won their first-round matches but lost in the championship quarterfinals.

Sophomore Jordan Albers went 1-2 at 112 pounds, losing in the first round but coming back to win a 2-0 decision in the consolation bracket. In his next match, he faced Mulvane's Garret Gage, last year's champion at 103 pounds.

Albers scored a takedown for the only points in the first period to lead 2-0 going into the second. Starting in the neutral position, neither wrestler could get the advantage over the other and the score remained 2-0 going into the third period.

Starting in the bottom position, Gage scored on an escape for one point then later picked up a point when Albers was penalized for stalling. The third period ended with the scored tied at 2, forcing a one-minute overtime. Starting in the neutral position, Gage was able to get a takedown, then two more match 6-2.

Senior Brandon Hatfield had a tough meet at 160 pounds, losing a 7-3 decision to Caleb Stultz of Columbus in the first round and later losing to a 6-2 decision to Wamego's Jared Brown in the consolation bracket.

Senior Chris Baumfalk injured his shoulder in the championship match at 171 pounds at the regional meet in Russell on Feb. 18 and had to default both his matches this weekend.
