

Graduate helps in win

A Goodland grad helped the Emporia State University baseball team go 3-1 at home over the weekend, boosting the Hornets' record to 6-1 for the season.

Emporia won both games of a doubleheader against the University of North Dakota on Friday at Trusler Sports Complex, beating the Fighting Sioux 12-3 in the opener then 6-5 in the nightcap.

On Saturday, the Hornets lost a single nine-inning game against Wayne State College (Neb.) during which the Bobcats scored two runs in the eighth inning to break a 5-all tie, then another in the ninth to win 8-5.

The Hornets again faced North Dakota again on Sunday, winning 10-1.

Junior pitcher Landon West, a 2003 graduate of Goodland High, made his third appearance for the season on Sunday, coming on in the eighth inning.

West threw out the first two batters he faced at first base after fielding grounders from both.

West gave up his first hit of the season when the next batter hit a single to left. However, West struck out the next batter, who went down swinging for the third out.

Emporia State broke in the NCAA Division II top 30 poll last week at No. 9. Wayne State fell nine spots to No. 27.

The Hornets, in the middle of a long home stretch, will return to the diamond on Wednesday for a doubleheader against Fort Hays State University.

Emporia State opened its season on Feb. 13, sweeping both games of a doubleheader against the Tigers in Hays.

Lady Trojans seventh

With just two games left in their regular season, the Lady Trojans of Colby Community College are still the highest-ranked Kansas team in junior college Division I basketball.

The Trojans are now 25-3 overall after beating Dodge City Community Saturday in Colby 70-57. They lead the West Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference with a 13-1 record.

Sophomore Suzana Sormaz scored 30 points to lead the team hitting on eight of 12 shot from three-point range. Sophomore Rita Kollo scored 16 and sophomore Ivy

Ramsey, a 2004 Colby High graduate, scored eight.

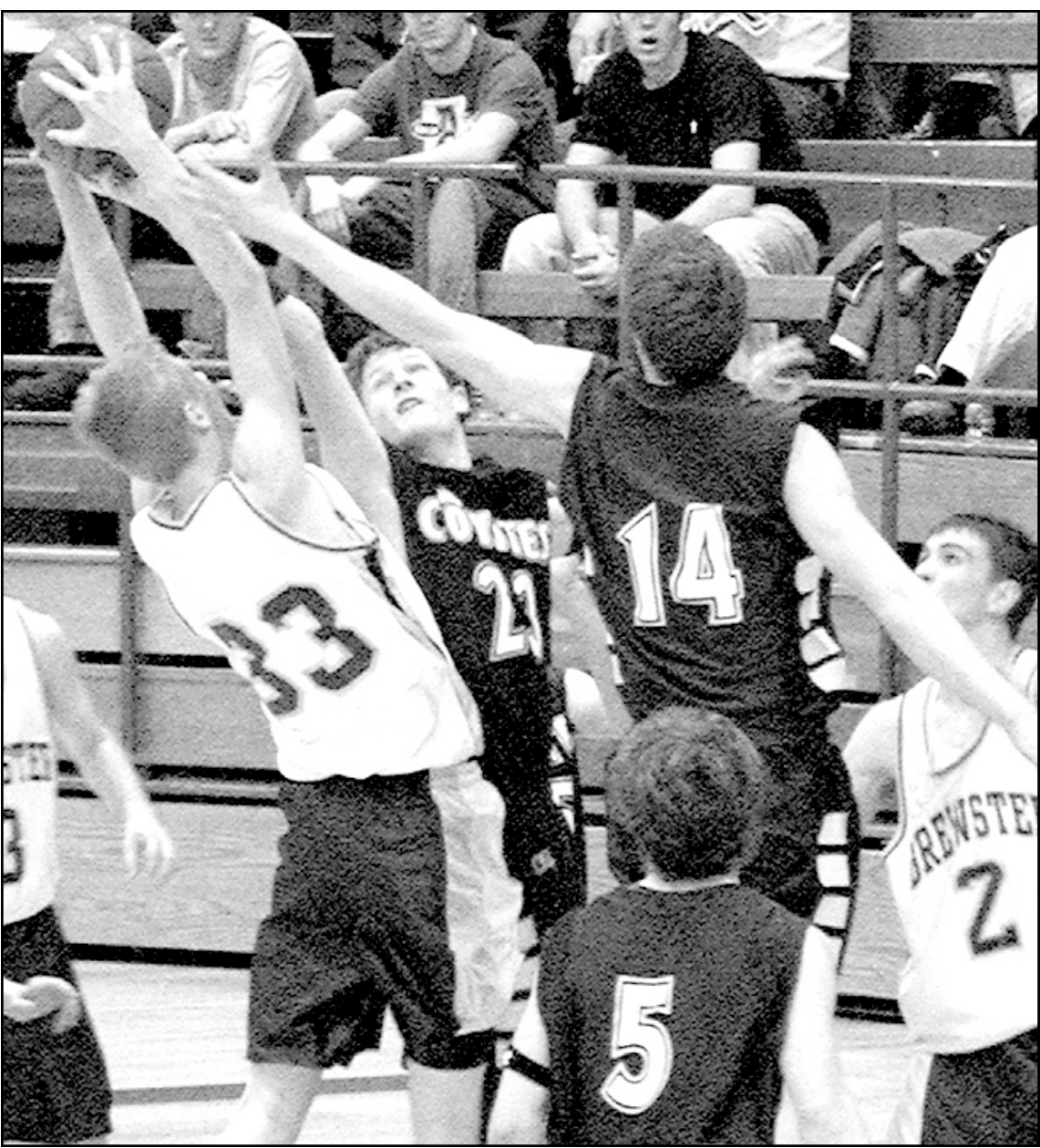
Former Cowgirl Jessica Osborn, a sophomore at Dodge City, saw some court action Saturday against the Trojans. Osborn, in her first season with the Lady Conquistadors, has played in 14 games this season, scoring nine points and grabbing 14 rebounds.

Colby was ranked No. 7 for the second straight week in last Wednesday's poll by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Cloud County Community College, at 24-5, was No. 11 and the

East Division's Labette Community College, 26-2, was No. 17.

Colby closes out the regular season with a road game against Pratt on Wednesday, then travels to Great Bend on Saturday to play Barton County. The Lady Conqs head to Great Bend on Wednesday, then finish up with a home game against Hutchinson on Saturday.

The Region VI playoffs begin on Saturday, March 11, at Wichita State University. The national tournament starts 10 days later at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

Brewster boys and girls advance to substate action

Both of Brewster High School's basketball teams won their regional Class 1A tournaments Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse to advance to the substate level, but this time they will play at different locations.

The boys will tipoff against Ness City at 5 p.m. (Mountain Time) Thursday in Phillipsburg. The girls head to Russell on Friday to take on Western Plains High of Ransom. Tipoff will be at 7:30.

The championship games will be on Saturday. If both Brewster teams advance to the title game, the girls final will be played at 4 p.m. and the boys at 5:30. If not, the girls final in Russell will tipoff at 5 p.m. and the boys championship game in Phillipsburg at 6:30.

The Bulldogs improved to 22-1 for the season after defeating

Wallace County High of Sharon Springs 59-47 on Saturday in Goodland. Freshman Jeff Reid led Brewster with 15 points, followed by sophomore Jance McKee with 14 and senior Kyle O'Connor with 12.

Senior Branson Gilley added 10 points, with senior Karman Selby scoring five and senior Jonathan Collett three.

The Bulldogs advanced to the regional finals with an 82-45 win over the Coyotes of Weskan on Thursday at Max Jones. Wallace County beat Golden Plains High of Rexford 60-50 to advance.

The Lady Bulldogs head to Russell with a 21-2 record after edging Golden Plains High of Rexford on Saturday 48-45.

Junior Avery Schultz led the team

with 12 points. Junior Danie Bedore scored 10, followed by senior Jaylin Reid with nine and junior Megan Allen with eight. Senior Caitlin Rush had five, and juniors Audrey Hoyt and Sarah Flanders both scored two.

The girls got to Saturday's game by beating Wallace County 65-46 on Friday. Golden Plains made it to the final by defeating Weskan 62-44 Friday.

Other Western Kansas Liberty League teams still in the hunt for the state Class 1A championship include the boys from Wallace County and Greeley County High of Tribune, who face each other on Thursday in Russell, and the girls from Grinnell and Golden Plains, who play each other on Friday in Phillipsburg.
