Cowboys win by 26, defeat Hugoton 79-53

The Cowboys basketball team defeated the Hugoton Eagles 79-53 Tuesday at Max Jones Fieldhouse to advance to tonight's substate semifinal game against the Scott Community High at Al Billinger Fieldhouse in Scott City.

Tipoff for tonight's game against the Beavers will be around 6:30 (Mountain Time) and will be broadcast live on Goodland radio KLOE (730 AM) with Rollie Hallagin calling the action.

Senior Derek Fenner took a pass from senior Wyatt Dautel and

scored the basket, which broke a 4-all tie halfway through the first period Tuesday and the Cowboys stayed in front for the rest of the game.

The Cowboys led 17-12 after the first quarter and 35-24 at halftime. Goodland out scored Hugoton 20-15 in the third period and 24-14 in the fourth to make the final 79-53.

Four Cowboys scored in double figures led by senior Jase Herl with 17 points. Junior Nick Angelos had 13 points, Dautel 11 and junior Mikey Doll 10.

Senior Jon Beeson scored nine points, all from three-point range,

and both Fenner and senior Heath Chatfield scored six. Freshman Greg Farris had three points, and sophomore Tanner Smith and freshman Travis Angelos both scored two.

Nick Angelos started the scoring with a pair of free throws. Hugoton's Justen Slaughter tied the game at 2 with a basket a short time later. The two teams exchanged baskets to make it 4-all after which Goodland scored four straight on baskets by Fenner and Chatfield.

After that, the Cowboys edged the Eagles 9-8 to take a 17-12 lead into the second period. Hugoton

scored the first four points of the second quarter to get within one at 17-16 but Dautel hit a three-pointer which started a 7-0 run for the home team making the Cowboys' lead 24-16.

Over the next four minutes the Eagles worked to cut into Goodland's lead and trailed by only three, 26-23, with 1:20 left on the clock. However, the Cowboys scored nine of the final 10 points of the half to take a 35-24 lead into the locker room at the intermission.

Both teams scored 15 points in the first seven minutes 30 seconds of the third period to make the score

50-39. However, Herl hit a pair of free throws with 26 seconds left and Beeson hit from three-point range in the final seconds to give Goodland a 55-39 lead going into the final quarter.

The Cowboys dominated in the first four minutes of the fourth period outscoring the Eagles 12-5 making the score 67-44. Following a timeout by Hugoton, Goodland

continued to do most of the scoring edging the Eagles 12-9 making the final 79-53.

The Cowboys out rebounded Hugoton 39-22. Herl led the team with 11 boards with both Nick Angelos and Chatfield grabbing six. The Eagles did a better job at the free throw line hitting on 20 of 30 compared to 12 of 23 for Goodland.

Goodland faces top ranked Beavers tonight

The Cowboys face a major challenge tonight at Al Billinger Fieldhouse in Scott City as they face the top-ranked Beaver basketball team which in addition to enjoying a home court advantage has only lost twice this season.

The game tips off around 6:30 p.m. (Mountain Time). Goodland radio KLOE (730 AM) will broadcast the game live starting about 15 minutes before tipoff with Rollie Hallagin calling the action.

Goodland, now 14-7 for the season, advanced to tonight's substate semifinal with a 79-53 home win over the Hugoton Eagles Tuesday.

The Beavers, 18-2, beat Russell Tuesday 76-25 in Scott City to

move on.

Twelve Beavers scored in their game against Russell led by senior Drew Crist with 15 points and junior Corbin Kuntzsch with 13. Scott City's defense held Russell to eight points or less in all four periods of the game.

There are seven seniors on the Beavers' roster, four of whom are six feet two inches or taller.

"Scott City has an excellent team," said Cowboys coach Jon McLean. "They have good size and speed, and they have good experience on their ball club. We will have to play an excellent game to have a chance to win."

The first of Scott City's two

losses came on Dec. 9 when the Beavers lost at home to the Jackrabbits from Greeley County High of Tribune.

The second loss was on Jan. 29 when the Beavers traveled to Hays to play the Monarchs of Thomas More Prep-Marian. A pair of free throws by the Monarchs with four seconds left on the clock turned a one-point deficit into a one-point win 55-54.

Scott City avenged that loss "bigtime" on Feb. 10 with a 68-42 home win in which four Beaver players scored in double figures.

Scott City is ranked No. 1 in Class 4A in the latest polls.

In the other boys semifinal today

in Scott City the Tigers of Ulysses take on Thomas More. The Tigers defeated Larned 66-41 Tuesday in Ulysses while the Monarchs shot down the Colby Eagles 81-46 in Hays.

Thomas More is ranked No. 2 by the *Eagle* and No. 3 by the *Capital-Journal*.

The boys final will tipoff around 6:30 p.m. (Mountain Time) Saturday at Al Billinger Fieldhouse in Scott City.

"Our kids will be prepared and they will do all they can to give themselves the best possible chance to win," McLean said. "It should be an exciting night of basketball."
