

Cowboys end season, lose to Beavers 79-45

The Cowboys basketball team ended its season Friday with a 79-45 loss to Scott Community High in the substate semifinals at Al Billinger Fieldhouse in Scott City.

The Beavers led 15-11 after the first period, increasing their lead to nine points by halftime, 33-24. Scott City dominated the second half, outscoring Goodland 25-12 in the third period and 21-9 in the fourth to make the final 79-45.

"I was extremely proud of the way the kids played the first half," said Cowboys coach Jon McLean. "We did not play scared and we were definitely in the ball game at halftime. They just took over the second half. We just could not hang with them for the entire game."

The Cowboys finished their season 14-8. The Beavers are now 21-2 after beating Thomas More Prep-Marian 74-38 Saturday in the substate finals. Scott City is the top seed at the Class 4A state tournament, which begins Thursday at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

"They have a tremendous team," McLean said. "They have a great shot of winning the 4A state title."

The Beavers jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the first 90 seconds of Friday's game against Goodland before junior Nick Angelos made

his presence known by getting the Cowboys to their only lead of the game.

Angelos fed the ball to senior Derek Fenner under the basket for Goodland's first two points. Angelos scored on a free throw a short time after to make it 4-3, then drove in from the top of the key about 45 seconds later to put the Cowboys up 5-4.

Scott City's Tim Peintner scored the next five points, starting an 11-4 run by the Beavers which gave them a 15-9 lead with less than two minutes left in the quarter. A layup by senior Wyatt Dautel with 20 seconds showing made the score 15-11 heading into the second period.

Scott City scored the first seven points of the second quarter, increasing its lead to 11 points, 22-11. After that, the Beavers maintained at least a 10-point margin until junior Mikey Doll hit from three-point range with less than five seconds left in the half to get the Cowboys within nine at halftime, 33-24.

Doll scored the second half's first two points 40 seconds into the third period to get Goodland within seven, but a minute later Scott City was up by 13 at 41-28. After a pair of free throws by senior Jase Herl made it 41-30, the Beavers scored nine straight for a 50-30 lead.

Both teams then scored six points

to make it 56-36 with a minute left in the quarter. Scott City's Corbin Kuntzsch grabbed an offensive rebound and scored at the buzzer, making the score 58-36 heading into the final period.

The Beavers continued to widen the gap and led 66-40 halfway through the fourth quarter. A short time later, Dautel hit a three-pointer to make the score 67-45 with just over three minutes left, but the Beavers scored the last 12 points of the game to win 79-45.

"I was proud of the kids," said Coach McLean. "They played hard regardless of the score."

Three Cowboys scored in double figures, led by Herl with 15 points. Doll scored 11 points and Dautel 10. Angelos added five, and both Fenner and senior Heath Chatfield scored two.

The Beavers won the battle of the boards out rebounding Goodland 32-19. Angelos led the Cowboys with five boards followed by Herl with four.

Scott City had a big edge from three-point range making 10 of 20 shots while Goodland connected on just three of 16.

The Cowboys did better at the free throw line making 10 of 12 while the Beavers hit on five of nine.

Brewster boys play at Hays today

The Brewster High School boys basketball team beat the Tigers of Natoma High 84-62 in the substate final Saturday in Phillipsburg advancing to the state championships which begin today at Fort Hays State University.

The Bulldogs, seeded No. 4, take on the Panthers of Centralia High at 4:45 p.m. Tuesday. Brewster is 24-1 heading into today's action.

The Panthers, seeded No. 5, are 22-3 after they defeated Blue Valley High of Randolph 54-26 Saturday in the substate final in Holton.

Leading the Brewster boys in scoring against Natoma was freshman Jeff Reid with 29 points. Sophomore Jance McKee scored 26 and senior Jonathan Collett had 10 points.

Sophomore Michael Collett added seven points, and seniors Karman Selby and Kyle O'Connor both scored four. Senior Branson Gilley and freshman Tyler O'Connor both had two points.

The Lebo Wolves, last year's state runner up, is the tournament's top seed with a 25-0 record. South Gray High of Montezuma is seeded No. 2 and also is 25-0 for the season. Macksville, which finished third in the state last year, is the No. 3 seed also at 25-0.

Should the Bulldogs defeat Centralia, they will face the winner of the Lebo-Claflin game at 4:45 p.m. Thursday at Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays. Brewster and Centralia both advanced to the state championships last year with each

losing in the first round.

The Lady Bulldogs quest for the state title was stopped Saturday in Russell with a 50-37 loss to Lady Wildcats of Claflin. Junior Dani Bedore led Brewster with 13 points with both senior JayIn Reid and junior Avery Schultz scoring 11. Senior Caitlin Rush scored the other two points for the Bulldogs.

Claflin, the defending state champion, is the top seed in the girls bracket with a 24-1 record. Brewster was seeded No. 1 with a 25-0 record at the state tournament last year by lost to Wetmore by one point in the first round. Wetmore lost to Claflin in the championship game.

The Lady Bulldogs of Golden Plains slipped by unbeaten Eastern

Heights 63-58 Saturday in the substate finals at Phillipsburg. Golden Plains earned a trip to Hays to play in the 1A state basketball tournament.

Valerie Broeckelman and Katelyn Spreser both pumped in 18 points while Kendra Spreser chipped in with 10. Rounding out the scoring was Jessica Shaw with nine, Megan Juenemann with seven and Ashley Albers with one.

Golden Plains outrebounded the Mustangs 34-17 which proved to be the difference in the game. Golden Plains is 22-2 on the season.

The first round opponent for the Bulldogs will be Deerfield, also 22-2. Game time is 4:45 p.m. Wednesday.

Lady Indians play Wednesday in Manhattan

The Goodland Cowgirls are not the only Northwest Kansas League team still in the hunt for a state basketball title, the Lady Indians of Hoxie will head to Manhattan Wednesday for the Class 2A championships.

Hoxie is seeded No. 6 with a 19-4 record and will face Berean Academy of Elbing at 3:45 p.m. Wednesday at Kansas State University.

The Lady Warriors, 21-2, are seeded third.

Hoxie defeated Rawlins County

High of Atwood 46-34 Saturday in the substate final in Ellis.

Senior Danielle Pratt led the Indians with 15 points followed by junior Rebecca Farber with 10.

This was the third meeting this season between Hoxie and Rawlins County with the Indians winning

the league game on Dec. 16 and the Lady Buffaloes winning a non league match up on Jan. 31.

The Lady Indians finished third last year at the state championships finishing the season 25-1.

The Lady Buffaloes of Belleville are seeded No. 1 and are 23-0 for the season.
