## Hank Breeden

Henry Webster Breeden, 76, owner of Hank's Cafe in Goodland, died Thursday, March 2, 2006, of acute leukemia and lung cancer at Sky Ridge Medical Center in Lone Tree, Colo.

He was born on Nov. 8, 1929, in Fauquier County, Va., the youngest of seven children of Nola Anna and Luther Garfield Breeden. He grew up in Fredricksburg, Va.

He was married three times. His first wife was Margie. They split up a year after their marriage and remained friends, a friend said.

His second wife was Beverly, the mother of his five children. After they divorced, he married Jean, who died of leukemia in 1997. Breeden spent 25 years in the Air

Force and retired as a senior master sergeant on Jan. 1, 1971. He got his start in the restaurant business in 1967 with Hank's Happy Acres on U.S. Highway 285 near Pine Junction, Colo., where the host was Senior Master Sgt. Hank Breeden.

Later, he owned and operated Hank's Happy Acres truck stop at the Bennett, Colo., exit off I-70 for 30 years from 1972 to 2002. In September 2003, he bought the former Ray's Cafe in Goodland. In February 2004, he opened it as Hank's Breeden also owned and oper-

ated the Happy Cat Bar in Aurora, Colo., Hank's II in Strasburg, Colo., and Granny's in Aurora.

He liked to gamble and took trips to Blackhawk, Las Vegas and Laughlin, Nev., with Lora Thomas of Highlands Ranch, Colo., whom he called his "lady friend." On Dec. 21, 2005, he hit a jackpot worth \$68,144 at Fitzgerald's in Blackhawk. He also enjoyed reading and

smoking big cigars, and at one time he owned property on Lake McConaughy near Ogallala, Neb. He was a member of Revelation

Lodge of Aurora, Colo., where he was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in 1963. He became a 32nd Degree Mason at Denver Consistory in 1968, and became a Noble in El Jebel Shrine in 1968. Breeden was also a member of

the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Posse in the 1970s.

Preceding him in death were his parents, three brothers, three sisters and a grandson.

Survivors include a daughter, Marsha Mooney of Goodland; four sons, Henry of Fredricksburg, Va., Ronald of Byers, Colo., Jeffery of Deer Trail, Colo., and Charles of Strasburg, Colo.; 16 grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be at 11 a.m. Saturday, March 11, 2006, at the Bennett High School gym. The Hope Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star will serve lunch after the service at the Bennett Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall. His body will be cremated, and his daughter will keep the ashes, according to his wishes, Thomas said. Memorials may be made to the

Darlene F. Romero, 72. Goodland, a homemaker, died Monday, March 6, 2006, at her


