Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of Sherman County, Kansas (the "County") that a special election has been called and will be held on March 28, 2006, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the County the following proposition:

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall Sherman County, Kansas, be authorized to (i) impose a one percent (1.0%) retailers' sales tax (the "Sales Tax") for the purpose of paying the costs of street and roadway improvements in the County (the "Improvements"), collection of such Sales Tax to commence on July 1, 2006, and to expire upon the payment of all costs incurred in the financing of the Improvements (including the retirement of any bonds issued and payable from such Sales Tax); and (ii) issue sales tax general obligation bonds (the "Bonds") in an amount not to exceed \$12,000,000, provided that the County receive, prior to such issuance, a comprehensive feasibility study that indicates the revenues received from such Sales Tax will be sufficient to retire such Bonds without the necessity of levying any ad valorem taxation, all pursuant to K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., as amended, including House Bill 2698 of the 2006 Kansas Legislature?
