The group charges a \$50 letter of intent fee (similar to a permit) which is good for one year. It is required on the installation or modification of all septic systems in the area.

The group will continue to offer free testing to private individuals. However, if you are selling, purchasing or refinancing any property that requires an inspection, the group will charge a \$90 fee. The inspection includes site evaluations on well and septic systems and testing the water. The group will also charge a \$25 fee for child care and foster care inspections.

Angus cow listed for superior traits

A Goodland woman has a registered cow listed by the American Angus Association for traits important in the economics of beef production.

The cow owned by Dondi Dawes was included in the association's 2006 Pathfinder Report, which identifies superior Angus cows based on performance traits of efficient beef production.

These include early and regular calving and heavy weaning weights, said Bill Bowman, the association's director of performance programs. More than 1,495,360 eligible dams were examined for Pathfinder status.

All registered Angus cows that meet the standards are listed, along with their owners, in the Pathfinder

Report published each year by the association.

Only 2,187 of the more than 34,000 American Angus Association members are represented in this year's report, said John Crouch, executive vice president of the association, with headquarters in St. Joseph, Mo.

The 2006 Pathfinder Report lists 9,321 individual cows and 258 Pathfinder sires. It is published in the April issue of the Angus Journal, and copies are available from the association.

The reports appear on the Web site at www.angus.org. Started in 1978, the Pathfinder Program recognizes outstanding breeders participating in the Angus Herd Improvement Records Program.
