Goodland High School sent two basketball players to Colby on Sunday for the 13th annual Sports Shoppe/Colby Bowl Northwest Kansas All-Star Classic, and both ending up as the top scorers in their games.

Justeen Koehler scored 27 points as she led the Dark Jerseys to a 65-61 win over the Light Jerseys in the girls game, while Jase Herl scored 24 to lead the Light Jerseys to a 109-97 win in the boys skirmish.

Thirty-six high school seniors, 20 girls and 16 boys, played in this year's Classic at the Colby Community Building.

With about three seconds left on the clock, Kendra Matteson of Agra's Eastern Heights High hit the game's final basket from threepoint range making the final 65-61. Michaela Berg of Eastern

Heights, who won the girls' threepoint shooting contest, led the Light Jerseys with 13 points, followed by Matteson with 12. Baird scored 10.

Rush finished the game with seven points and Colby's Jessica Stephens scored six for the Dark Jersevs.
