> Church fights: (James 1:19-20; 3:13-18) Apparently, the believers James addressed were at war with each other over positions in the church. Many of them wanted to be teachers and leaders. When they studied the word, the result was not edification, but strife and arguments. Each person thought that his ideas were the only correct ideas and his ways the only right ways. Selfish ambition ruled their meetings, not spiritual submission.

## Despite snow, drought raises questions about which crops to plant chance of producing that year.

Although we have received a good snow this week, the continuing drought in northwest Kansas raises questions about which row crops to plant in non irrigated fields

Kansas farmers often must decide whether to plant dryland corn or grain sorghum. Part of the decisionmaking process involves the depth of soil moisture at planting time.

Scott Staggenborg, Kansas State University cropping systems specialist, and Loyd Stone, soil physics professor, in-season precipitation and temperatures ultimately have the biggest impact on yield of these crops, but depth of soil moisture at planting is also important.

Research in Kansas has shown that it takes a certain amount of water for a given crop to produce its first unit of grain, and that amount is different for each crop.

The amounts of water required to produce the first unit of grain for crops in the area are: corn - 10.9 inches, grain sorghum — 6.9 inches, soybeans — 7.8 inches, sunflowers — 5.4 inches and wheat -10.0 inches.

An average silt loam soil holds about two inches of available water per foot of soil. Therefore, four feet of moist silt loam soil would contain

about eight inches of available water for crops.

Based on minimum moisture requirements, dryland corn has the best chance for success where a silt loam soil has four feet or more of moist soil at planting time. If the same soil has less than four feet of moist soil, grain sorghum probably has a better


