Cowboys splits doubleheader in opener

The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys opened their baseball season Monday in Burlington by splitting a doubleheader against the Cougars, dropping the first game 12-2 in six innings then coming back to win the nightcap 9-3.

In the opener, Goodland scored a pair of runs in the top of the first and held a 2-0 lead until the bottom of the fourth, when Burlington picked up four runs on four hits.

The Cowboys went "three-andout" in the top of the fifth, then the Cougars added two more runs before Goodland made a pitching change, sending senior Wyatt Dautel to the mound. The next batter hit a grounder for the third out leading 6-2
