NOTICE OF CLASS AC-TION

To: INDIRECT PURCHAS-ERS OF CHOLINE CHLORIDE CONTAINING PRODUCTS FOR LIVESTOCK IN KANSAS FROM JANUARY 1, 1985-DE-CEMBER 31, 1998.

PLEASE READ THIS NO-TICE CAREFULLY. YOUR RIGHTS MAY BE AFFECTED.

THIS NOTICE IS NOT AN EXPRESSION OF ANY OPIN-ION BY THE COURT AS TO THE MERITS OF ANY OF THE CLAIMS OR DEFENSES AS-SERTED BY EITHER SIDE IN

IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF THIS LITIGATION. THE SOLE Kansas who indirectly pur- dants' conduct as alleged by the **PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE IS** TO INFORM YOU OF THE LAWSUIT SO THAT YOU CAN MAKE AN INFORMED DECI-SION AS TO WHETHER YOU SHOULD REMAIN IN OR OPT OUT OF THIS CLASS ACTION.

BACKGROUND OF THE CASE

The Plaintiffs Premier Pork, Inc., Grain Sorghum Hogs Inc., and Beef Belt Feeders, Inc. are Kansas livestock owners that allege that from January 1, 1988-December 31, 1998, Defendants DCV, Inc. and DuCoa, L.P. (hereafter "Defendants") violated the Kansas antitrust laws by conspiring or combining to fix the price and control the market for choline chloride. Choline use in livestock but not for resale chloride is an animal feed vitamin added to feed rations for poultry, turkeys and swine, and can be purchased either as pure choline chloride or incorporated into feed rations. The Plaintiff alleges that as a result of the Defendants unlawful conduct, the price of Choline Chloride was substantially higher than it would have been otherwise in a competitive market. Consequently, Class Members paid substantially higher prices for Choline Chloride than they should have during the time period January 1, 1988 to the end of 1998. The Defendants deny these claims and charges.

CLASS ACTION RULING

On March 2, 2006, the Court ruled, over Defendants' objections, that this lawsuit may be maintained as a class action for: All natural persons and business entities (whether as sole proprietorships, partnerships, corporations or other business organizations) in the State of laws arising from the Defen-

chased, not for resale, choline chloride or products containing choline chloride in the State of Kansas to use as an animal feed additive (excluding pet food) from 1988 and to the December 31, 1998 ("the Class Period"). Choline chloride products means (1) B4 (choline chloride); (2) choline chloride animal feed premixes containing and/or incorporating such choline chloride; and (3) other choline chloride products containing and/or incorporating such choline chlorides sold to Plaintiffs and other purchasers in the State of Kansas

if you purchased Choline Chloride products in Kansas for end between January 1, 1988-December 31, 1998. YOU ARE **NOT** A CLASS MEMBER if you purchased Choline Chloride: (1) directly from a choline chloride manufacturer, (2) for resale, (3) outside Kansas, (4) for pets or human consumption, or (5) for the government.

ELECTION BY CLASS MEMBERS

If you fit the above description of a Class Member, you have a choice whether or not to remain in the Class on whose behalf this lawsuit is being prosecuted. You should understand the consequences of this choice in making your decision.

1. If you want to remain a member of the Class, you do not have to do anything at this *time*. By remaining a Class Member, any claims you have against the Defendants for damages under the Kansas antitrust and trial schedule will be set.

class representative will be pursued by the Class Representatives and Class Counsel on a contingent fee basis. Your interest, along with the Class, will be represented by Plaintiffs' Class Counsel, Rex A. Sharp, Isaac L. Diel, and Keen Brantley. If they win, you will win. If they lose, you will lose. Either way, you will not be personally responsible for their fees or expenses since they have agreed to proceed with the litigation on a contingent fee basis. You may, of course, hire your own counsel to represent you in the case at your own expense.

2. If you want to be excluded YOUAREACLASS MEMBER from the Class, you must notify the Class Administrator, P.O. Box 8753, at Prairie Village, KS, 66208-0753 of your desire to be excluded by: (1) writing (not email or telephone), (2) stating your name, address, and telephone number (and that of attornev representing you, if any), and (3) mail the written exclusion so that it is *postmarked no later* than July 3, 2006. By making this election to be excluded: (a) you will not share in any verdict or settlement that might be paid to Class as a result of this lawsuit; (b) you will not be bound by any decision in this lawsuit favorable to the Defendants and will not benefit from any decisions in this lawsuit favorable to the Plaintiff: and (c) you may present any claims you may have against the Defendants by filing your own lawsuit at your own expense.

FURTHER PROCEEDINGS

The case will proceed as a class action with the Class as Plaintiff against the Defendants. Discovery on the merits of the case will continue, and a pretrial
