The Goodland Star-News The Sherman County 4-H Junior Leaders decided in June to send a care package to support the troops in Iraq and honor Goodland's fallen hero, Sgt. Derrick Lutters.

The gesture was returned at the opening of the 4-H Talent Night in March when Sgt. Mark Reasoner of the Goodland National Guard armory presented Devin Mangus and other Junior Leaders a special flag and certificate sent by Kansas troops in Iraq.

Mangus said after Lutters died in May, he asked the Junior Leaders if they would be interested in honoring the fallen soldier by sending a care box to his unit in Iraq.

"I was vice-president," he said, "and I was running the meeting in May when I asked if they would make a motion to send a box in honor of Derrick."

The club voted to spend \$300 on supplies, and Mangus said, they talked to appreciated the gifts. Lutter's sister Genevieve about what soldiers need.

"She said they need lotion, toothpaste and lots of deodorant," Mangus said. "I guess it is very hot over there, and I know what they are doing is hard.

"This moment has been captured to remember the heroes that came here and with their blood and sacrifice made freedom and democracy not only possible, but made them flourish.
