The Cowgirls track and field team finished in a tie for eighth place at the 71st annual Scott City Relays Tuesday, winning three events and placing second in three others.

The Cowboys finished 16th, taking second in one event.

Junior Emily Murray was a double winner, finishing first in the 100-meter high hurdles in 17.15 seconds and the 300-meter low hurdles in 53.63.

Junior Kaylee Billinger won the 400-meter dash in 1 minute, 6.65 seconds. Billinger cleared 4 feet, 8 inches in the high jump to finish in a tie for fifth and ran the 100-meter dash in 13.21 for sixth place.

Junior Stephanie Sheldon was second in the pole vault, clearing 9 feet. She teamed up with senior Tiffany Thomas, junior Whitney Dautel and freshman Brittaney Medrano to run the 4x800-meter relay in 11:25.16 for second place.

Sheldon teamed with Murray, Billinger and freshman Taylor McLemore to place fourth in the 4x100-meter relay in 56.21 seconds.

Freshman Michelle Smith threw the discus 106 feet, 11 inches to take second. Smith also competed in the shot put.
