Cowboys finish third

Junior Josh Cech won all four of his matches at the Goodland Invitational last Thursday, leading the Cowboys tennis team to a third-place finish.

Cech, playing No. 1 singles, started the tournament by beating Adam Taylor of Scott City 8-1. Cech next whipped Jeremy Crosby of Ulysses 8-4, then beat both Jarett Payne of Garden City and Weston Talsma of Colby 8-0.

The No. 1 singles and doubles matches were played at Steever park with No. 2 singles at Gulick Park and No. 2 doubles at Chambers. Each match consisted of one eight-game set with a tie-breaker at 7-all if needed.

Freshman Bryan Gray went 1-3 for the tournament at No. 2 singles, finishing fourth. The Cowboys' doubles teams both also went 1-4 to finish fourth. Senior Julian Walls

teamed up with sophomore Nathan Brady at No. 1 doubles, and juniors Jared Hall and Doug Eddleman got together at No. 2 doubles.

Freshman Brennan Clouse picked up some court time, playing No. 2 singles. He went 0-4 and ended up fifth. Scott Community High did not have a No. 2 singles player, giving Clouse a chance to play by filling in the bracket.

The Ulysses Tigers won the Invitational, winning at No. 2 singles and both doubles. Crosby placed second at No. 1 singles and the Tigers won 15 of 16 matches.

Ulysses scored 37 points with Garden City second at 22. Goodland scored 19. Colby was fourth with 13, followed by Scott City with nine.

The Cowboys opened their season at a six-team round robin in Larned on April 11. Cech won at

No. 1 singles for the second straight year. He went 4-1, finishing in a three-way tie for first, but had the greater overall win-loss percentage of games played. All matches consisted of one eight-game set.

"It was a good tournament for our first time out," said McKee. "We were able to get a lot of matches played."

Brady went 1-4 at No. 2 singles, finishing fifth. Eddleman and Gray teamed up for No. 2 doubles, going 0-5 and ending up sixth. Goodland did not play a No. 1 doubles team.

The Eagles of Ellinwood won the round robin with Ulysses second and the host team Larned third. Hoisington was fourth followed by Goodland and then Colby.

The Cowboys return to Larned today for a meet starting at noon (Mountain Time).

Goodland graduate plays in spring game

A pair of former Goodland Cowboys got to play in front of over 31,000 Kansas State University football fans Saturday in Manhattan for the Wildcats' annual spring game.

Senior tight end Donald Raymer caught three passes for 23 yards and a touchdown while helping the White Squad to a 21-14 win over

the Purple. Raymer caught an 8-yard pass from senior quarterback Dylan Meier for the game's first score a little past halfway through the first quarter.

Meier hit Raymer for a 5-yard gain earlier in that drive. In the second period, senior quarterback Allen Webb connected with Raymer for a 10-yard pass which gave the White Squad a first-and-10 on the Purple seven

yard line. Senior running back Donnie Anders ran in for a touchdown on the next play giving the White a 14-0 lead.

Sophomore center Jordan Bedore, who started eight games for the Wildcats last season, played for the Purple Squad. Bedore redshirted his first year.

Raymer played his freshman and sophomore seasons for the Bronco-busters of Garden City Community College. He was on the Wildcats'

roster last year but did not see any game time.

Two other players from northwest Kansas saw some action. Weskan native Clayton Cox, a junior defensive end, played for the White recording one tackle. Junior running back Terry Petrie, a graduate of Norton Community High, rushed six times for 38 yards for the Purple, including a 24-yard scamper for a first down on the White one in the second quarter.

Cox played two seasons with Raymer at Garden City but sat out last season. Petrie played in six games for K-State last season, mostly on special teams. He played his freshman year at Butler County Community College.

The Wildcats open their season on Saturday, Sept. 2, against Illinois State University, an NCAA Division I-AA team, in Manhattan, the first of four straight home games.
